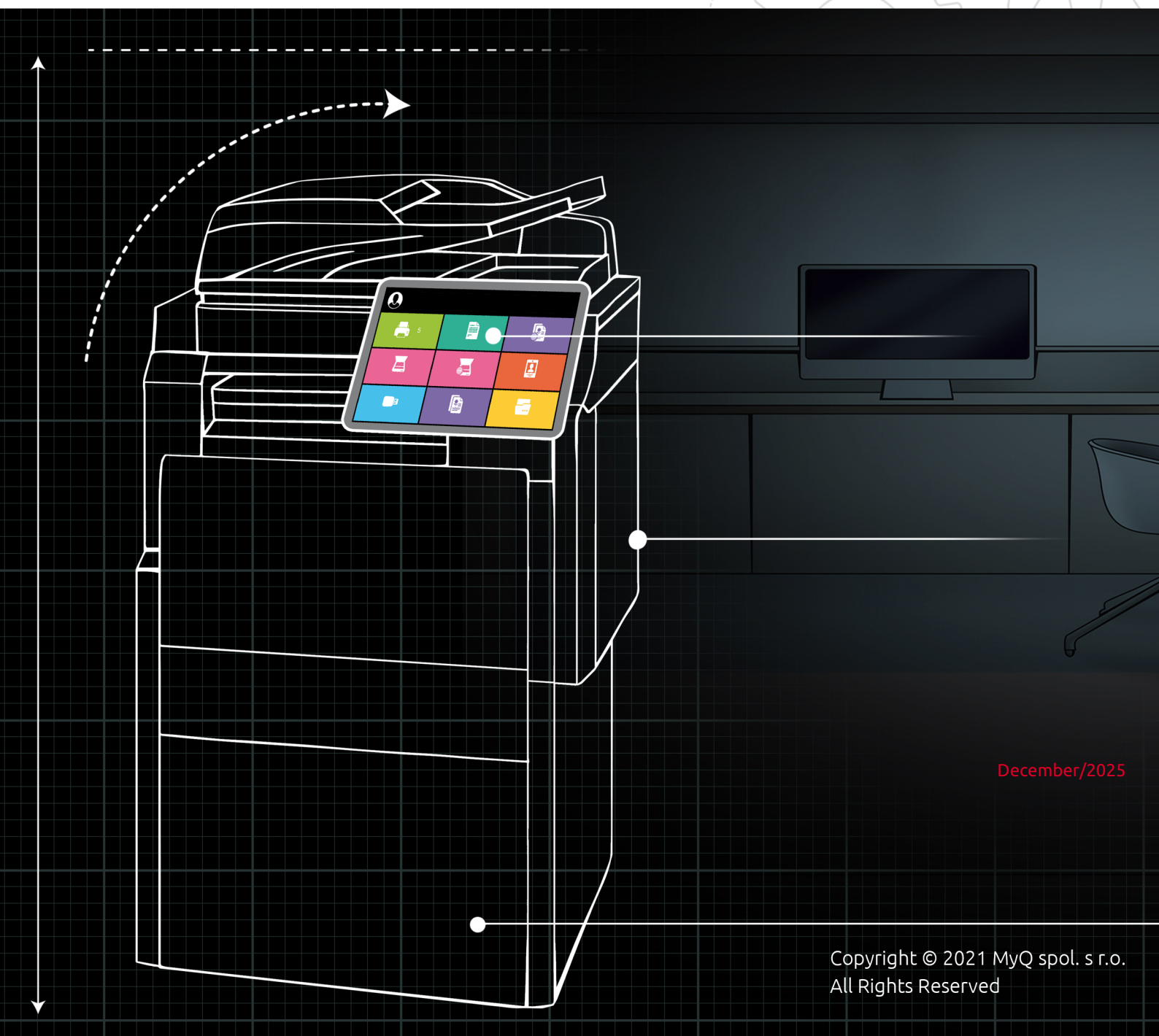

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MyQ Ricoh SmartSDK Embedded Terminal 10.1 RTM

The MyQ Ricoh SmartSDK Embedded terminal is a software application developed on the Ricoh SmartSDK platform. It enables simple management of print jobs on an Android touchscreen display, and offers a number of advanced features: multiple login options, scanning and copying by a single touch, credit, quota, project accounting, and many others. It can communicate with multiple types of USB card readers.

The application can be remotely installed on the printing device's Web User Interface.

1.1 Highlights

1.1.1 Easy Print

This new terminal action brings the ease of **Easy Scan** and **Easy Copy** to Printing. It allows users to print files from cloud storages, network drives, and local drives **without sending them to MyQ first**.

You can define the available sources and print properties, allowing users to choose the file they need, and print it, with just a few clicks.

1.1.3 Folder Browsing for Easy Scan

Simple scanning should not mean basic scanning, so we've added some new features.

Now you can specify the destination folder within your Cloud Storage (Google Drive, OneDrive, etc.) when scanning a document, and even edit the filename you'd like to save it as.

1.1.2 Job Preview on Embedded Terminals

Job preview is an essential feature in any printing environment, a last step on the printing journey **minimizing errors** and **saving paper**.

End users can now preview any job before printing directly on the embedded terminal, or in the MyQ mobile application, you simply need to click enable in your Job Settings.

1.1.4 Finishing Options

With the power of a 10.1 terminal, you can complete and perfect your job right at the device.

Our new finishing options such as **punching** and **stapling** can be edited with a few clicks at the terminal, and voila, **the job is done**.

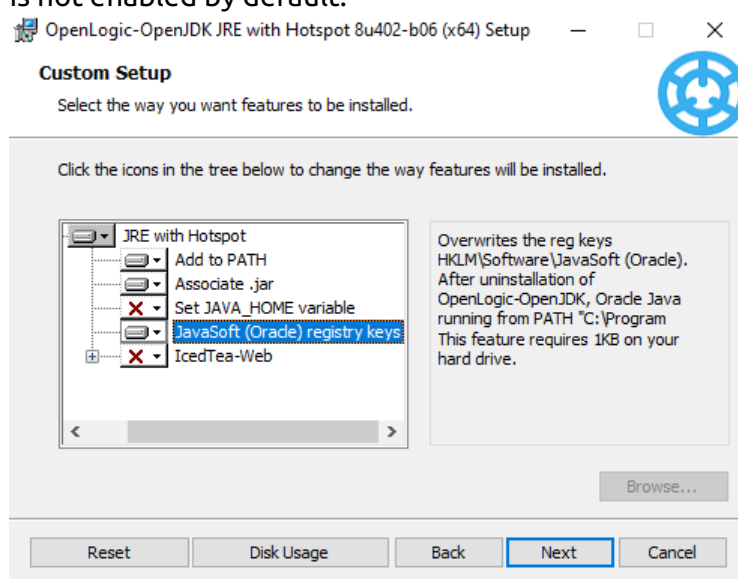

3 Installation

3.1 Requirements

The proper function of the MyQ Ricoh SmartSDK embedded terminal depends on the following:

- MyQ Web Server port (by default 443 in new installations) has to be allowed in the Firewall by default.
- The latest firmware should be installed on the device.
- Every embedded terminal requires a valid license activated on the MyQ server.
- MyQ Ricoh SmartSDK Embedded terminal 10.1 is supported on MyQ Print server 10.1 and newer.
- Java 8 Runtime Environment (JRE) installed on the MyQ Server.
 - OpenJDK Java is strongly recommended, for example, [this distribution from OpenLogic](#).
 - We do not recommend Oracle JRE (versions higher than 8u341 are not compatible with the Ricoh embedded installer).
 - It is necessary to enable installation of JavaSoft (Oracle) registry keys, which is not enabled by default.



ⓘ When restarting the printing device, do not use the software restart option on the device's Web UI. It does not restart all components used by the MyQ Embedded application, which results in problems with the connection to the MyQ Server.

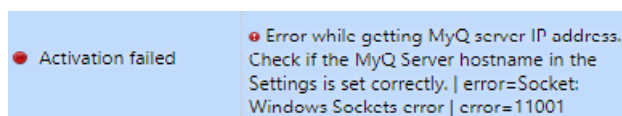

3.2 Remote installation via Printer Discovery

The easiest way to install the MyQ Ricoh SmartSDK Embedded terminal is via remote installation from the MyQ Web administrator interface. This method is very simple, and it is preferable, especially when you need to install the terminal on a large number of printing devices, since you can install multiple devices in a batch.

You do this by creating separate printer discoveries and adding a configuration profile to any one of them. At the same time, you can assign the discovered printers to a group and/or queue. Another possibility is to create a remote installation for just one printer and place it in a direct queue.

Before the installation, make sure that the server hostname/IP address in **MyQ, Settings, Network** is correct. If it's not, which could happen after a license update or upgrade, the remote setup will fail.



 If the remote setup fails, make sure that the latest firmware and the correct Java version are installed on your device. If not, update them and run the remote setup again. If you don't know how to do that, contact Ricoh support.

To remotely install the MyQ Ricoh SmartSDK Embedded terminal:

1. Follow the instructions in the MyQ Print Server guide to [create and configure a Printer Discovery](#).
2. Then, you should [create a configuration profile](#) to attach to your Printer Discovery.
3. The **Ricoh** section is displayed when the Ricoh terminal package is installed on the MyQ server. Applying the changes in the Ricoh section on the terminal requires a force remote configuration of the device.

Validate installer security certificates: ☐ When enabled, the Ricoh installer must trust the terminal CA certificate. Install the terminal CA certificate in the java keystore of the installer.

Installation timeout: Timeout for installation process to finish. If Ricoh terminal binaries installation and configuration does not finish in the given time, the process will be terminated. Value is given in minutes.

Discard pending jobs on logout: ☒ When enabled, queued jobs will be discarded from the print device on user logout. Applicable when Stop sending jobs after user logout is enabled.

Custom options: Codes to activate custom features of Embedded application.

Reject unauthorized print jobs: ☒ When enabled, device will only accept print jobs authorized by MyQ. All the other jobs will be rejected.

Set MyQ as device SMTP server: ☒ When enabled, email communication from the device is routed via MyQ server.

Job accounting mode: *

 Standard - All the job details will be properly accounted. Jammed papers will be included in accounted data. Advanced - All the job details will be properly accounted. Jammed papers will be excluded from accounted data. Basic - Use this mode only when facing issues with the standard accounting (specifically on PRO devices). Within this mode, the assignment of simplex/duplex to color/mono pages might not be completely reliable and could be mixed up for some of the jobs.

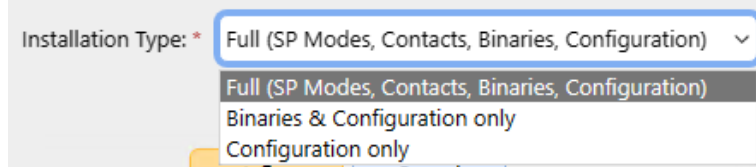
Fields marked by * are mandatory.

- It is possible to change the **Local Admin Pin**. When the field is empty, the default value **1087** is used.
- **Log debug messages** allows to enable/disable the Debug level of logging. If the setting is enabled, the terminal will generate additional log information for auditing and troubleshooting purposes.

- It is possible to specify the **Application List**, this allows you to edit the list of native application IDs that can be started from the Top Menu (Application List / Application Redirection) and Terminal Actions. Applications not added to this list will not be available on the terminal. In MyQ server 8.2, the list is delimited by commas, from MyQ server 10.0, each application should be listed on a single line. This list might be further filtered based on the logged-in user policies.

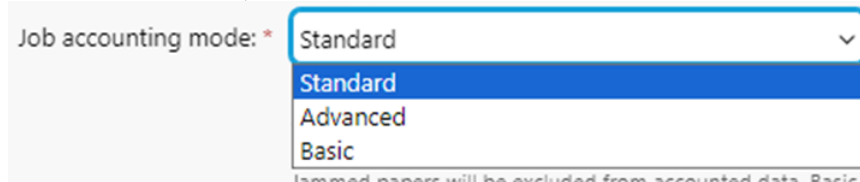


- It is possible to specify the **Installation type** - forces the type of the installation which is executed when activating the printer or forcing its configuration. For the proper terminal installation or terminal upgrade, the *Full* type of the installation is required. The other two types of installation should be used for debugging of issues. There are these options:



- *Full (SP Modes, Contacts, Binaries, Configuration)* - (default); performs a full installation including uninstallation of previous versions of the app (it also uninstalls the MyQ Roger app if present), settings SP modes, creating contacts, installing MyQ app binaries, and finally pushing the fresh configuration. May take around 5 mins; on certain very slow models (IM 2701), up to 20 mins.
 - *Binaries & Configuration only* - it only uninstalls the previous version of the app (including MyQ Roger), installs new binaries, and pushes the fresh configuration. Useful for debugging purposes when MyQ has been already installed (SP modes are already set) and only the binaries are to be exchanged. May take around 3 mins. Slow models up to 10 mins.
 - *Configuration only* - it only pushes the new configuration. Useful for debugging purposes when only configuration is to be refreshed. Takes only 5 seconds.
- **Validate installer security certificates** When enabled, the Ricoh installer must trust the terminal CA certificate. Install the terminal CA certificate in the java keystore of the installer.

- **Custom options** It is possible to specify Custom options. With this parameter, the administrator can unlock some hidden features of the terminal which are available only to specific customers and might require specific device/firmware.
- **Reject unauthorized print jobs** allows to enable/disable rejecting of unauthorized jobs. This option is enabled by default. If the option is enabled, the device will only accept print jobs authorized by MyQ, and all other jobs will be rejected. If the option is disabled, it is possible to print jobs for users who are not registered in MyQ. The printer driver has to be configured like direct print for local spool jobs.
- **Set MyQ as device SMTP server** allows to configure the MyQ IP address/hostname as the device's SMTP server for Panel scan operation during the remote configuration. This option is enabled by default. If the option is disabled, the device's SMTP server is not configured during the remote configuration.
- **Job accounting mode** - the way how the terminal accounts for the finished jobs (concerns Print and Copy jobs only; Scan/Fax jobs are always accounted for in Standard mode).



- *Standard* - (default) - All the job details will be properly accounted for. Jammed papers will be included in the accounted data.
- *Advanced* - Advanced - All the job details will be properly accounted for. Jammed papers will be excluded from accounted data.
- *Basic* - Use this mode only when facing issues with the standard accounting (specifically on PRO devices). Within this mode, the assignment of simplex/duplex to color/mono pages might not be completely reliable and could be mixed up for some of the jobs.

3.3 Additional Configuration on the Device

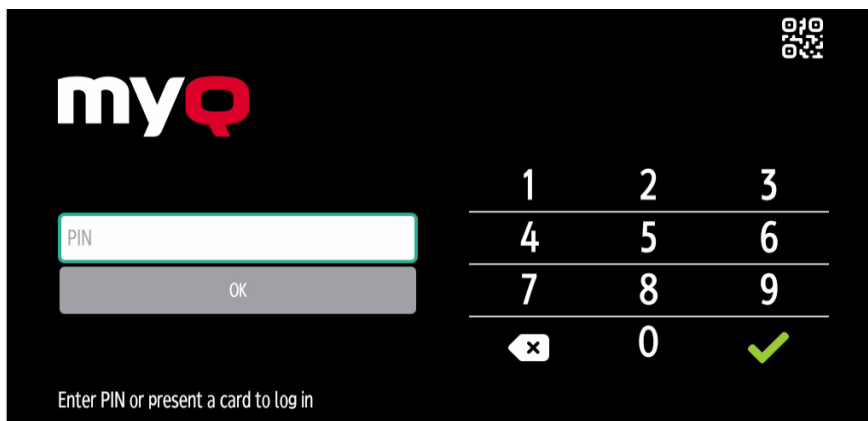
Before you can start using the terminal, you need to change the following settings on the printing device:

- Set the screen startup mode
- Set printing limits

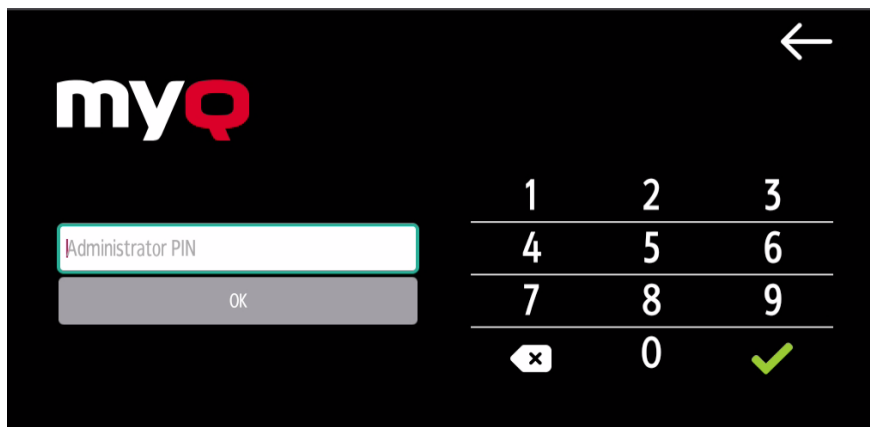
3.3.1 Setting the screen startup mode

To do this, you need to unlock the device's Android panel screen, open the printing device system settings and set the **Screen Startup Mode**.

1. On the initial screen of the MyQ Embedded application, tap **MyQ** to open the admin login screen.



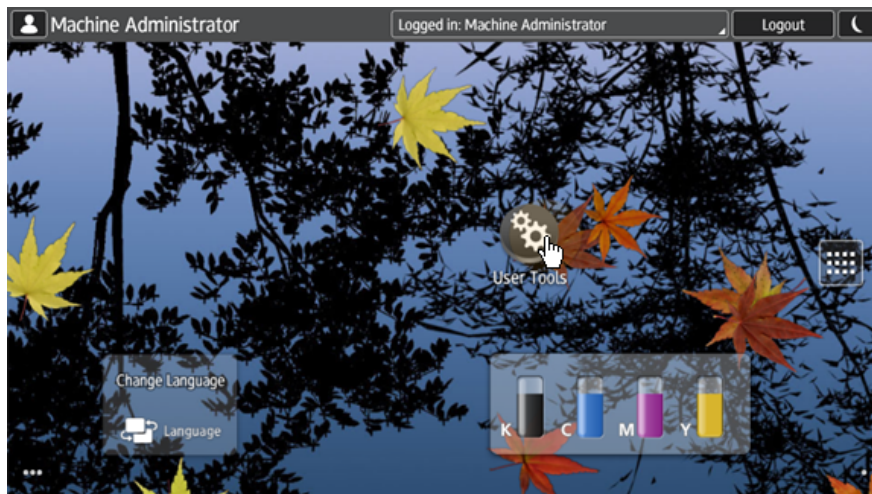
2. On the admin login screen, enter the admin password (the default password is **1087**), and then tap **OK**. The Admin menu opens.



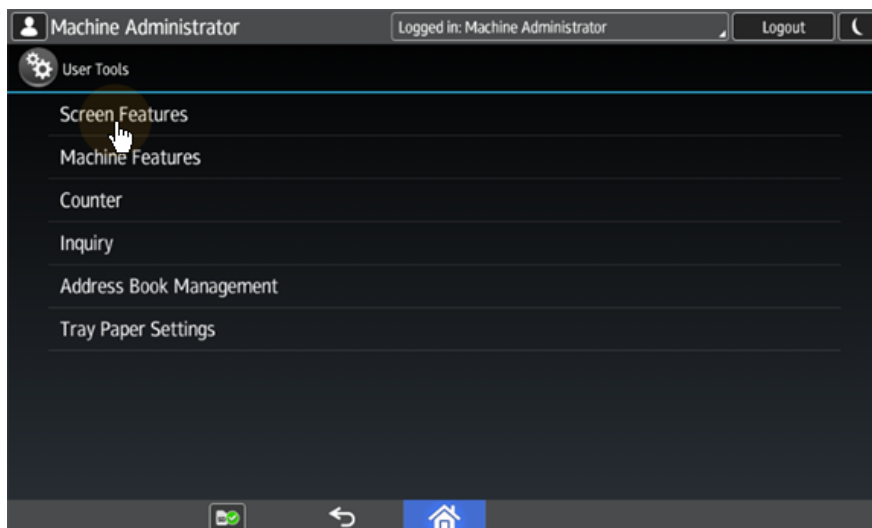
3. Tap **System settings** in the menu on the right side of the screen. The device's panel screen opens.



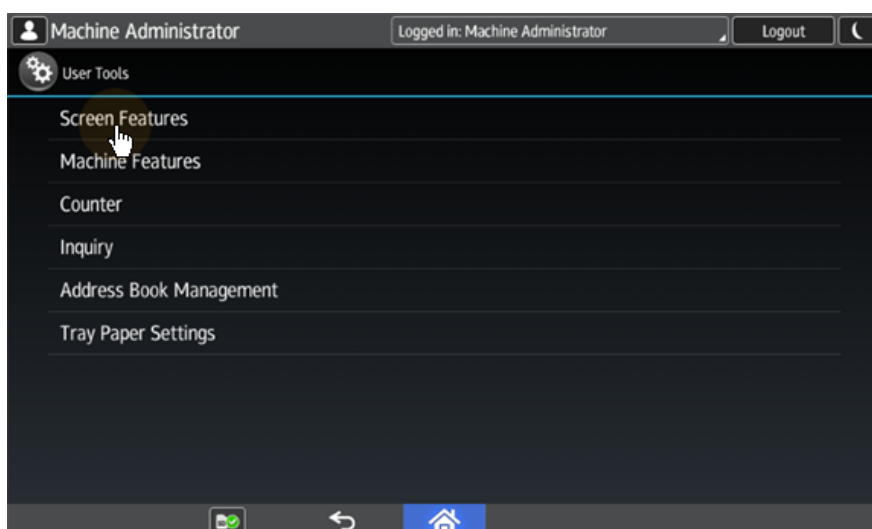
4. On the screen, tap **User Tools**. The User Tools screen opens.



5. Tap **Screen Features**. The Screen Features screen opens.



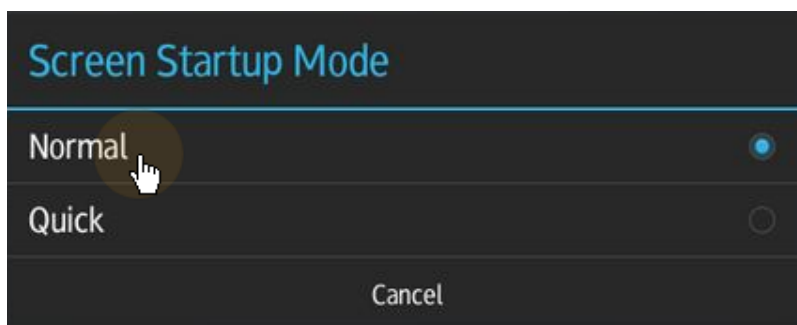
6. Tap **Screen Device Settings**. The Screen Device Settings screen opens.



7. Tap **Screen Startup Mode**. The Screen Startup Mode widget opens.



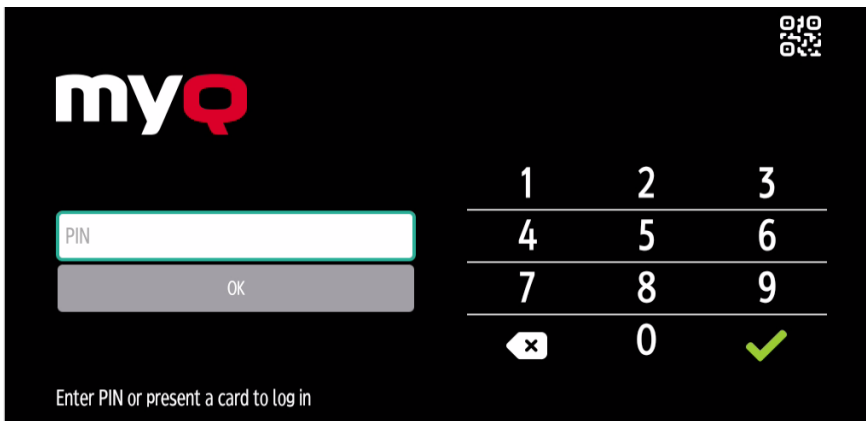
8. On the widget, tap **Normal**.



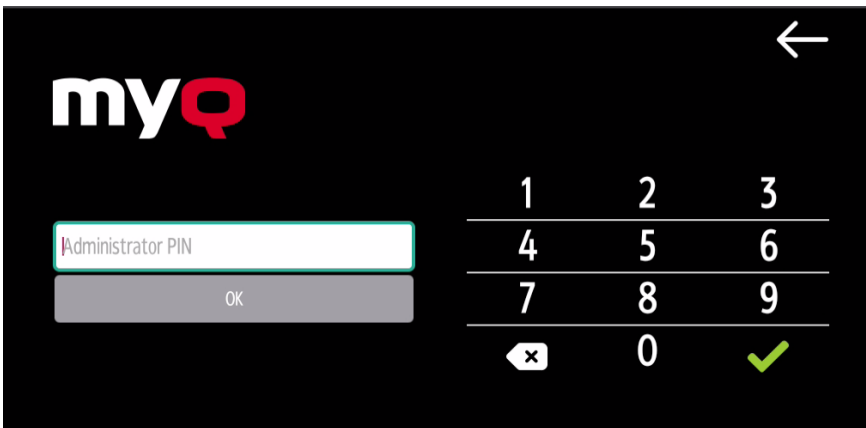
3.3.2 Setting printing limits

To do this, you need to unlock the device's Android panel screen, open the printing device system settings and change two settings there: the **Machine action when limit is reached** setting, and the **Enhanced Print Volume Use Limitation** setting.

1. On the initial screen of the MyQ Embedded application, tap **MyQ** to open the admin login screen.



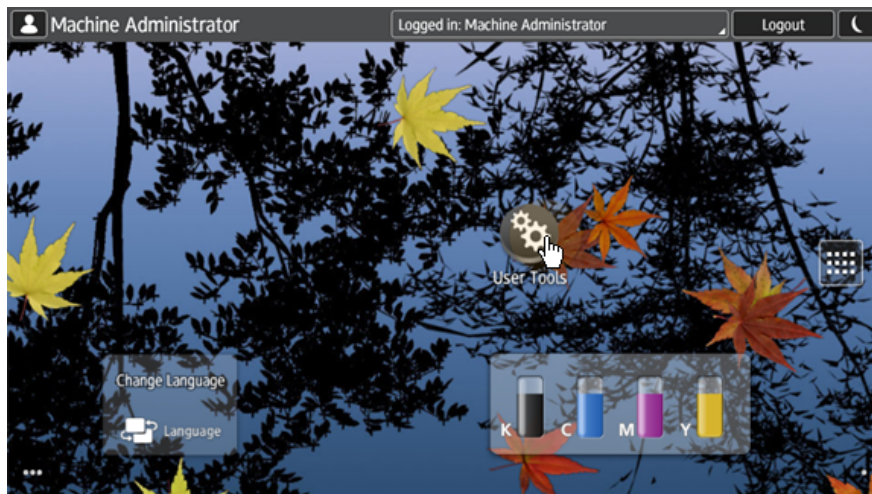
2. On the admin login screen, enter the admin password (the default password is **1087**), and then tap **OK**. The Admin menu opens.



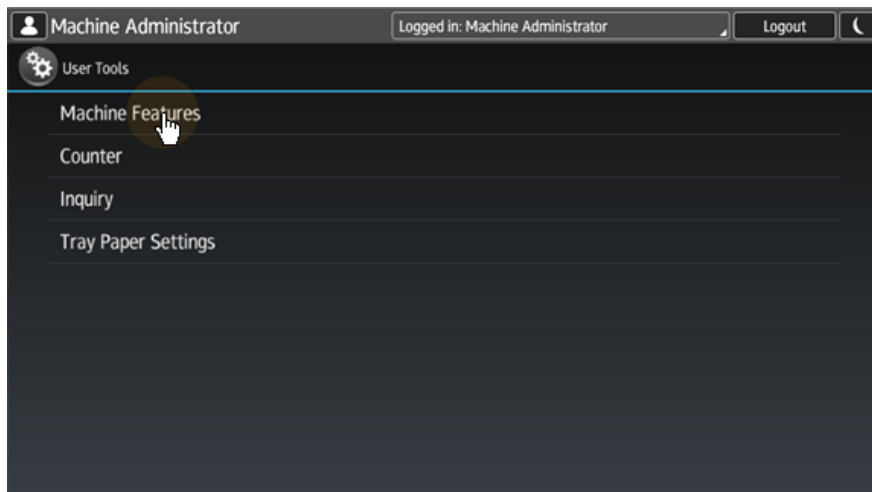
3. Tap **System settings** in the menu on the right side of the screen. The device's panel screen opens.



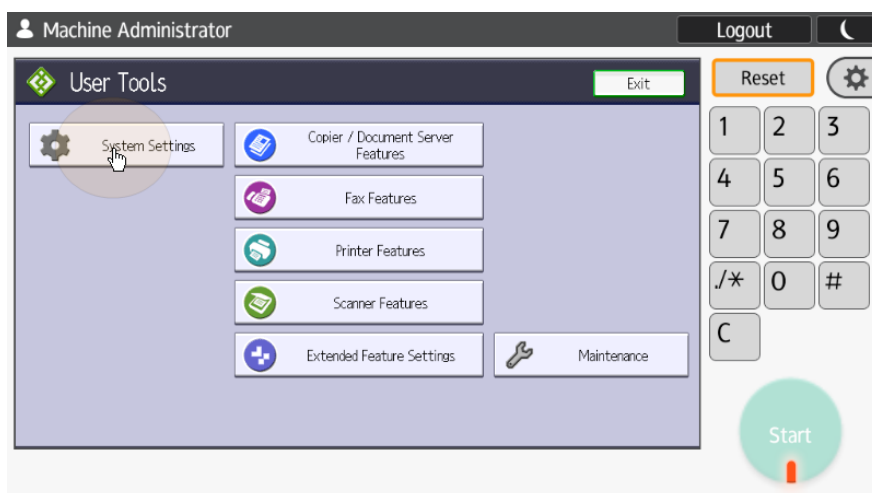
4. On the screen, tap **User Tools**. The User Tools screen opens.



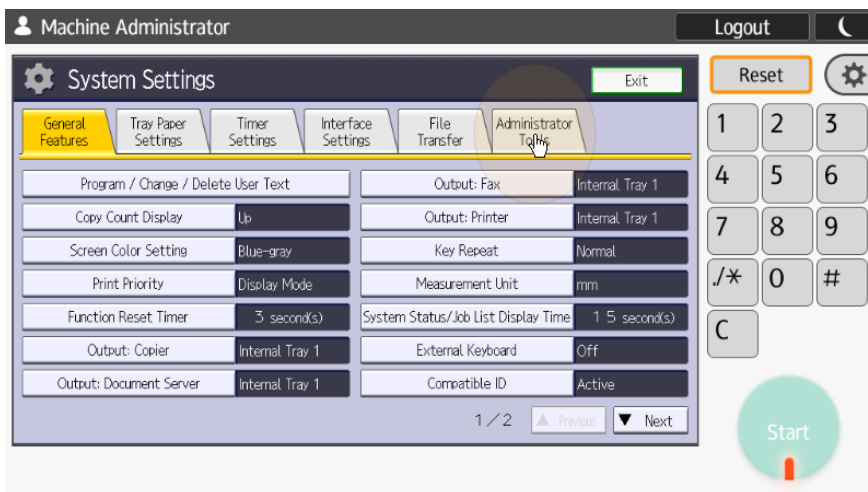
5. Tap **Machine Features**. The Machine Features screen opens.



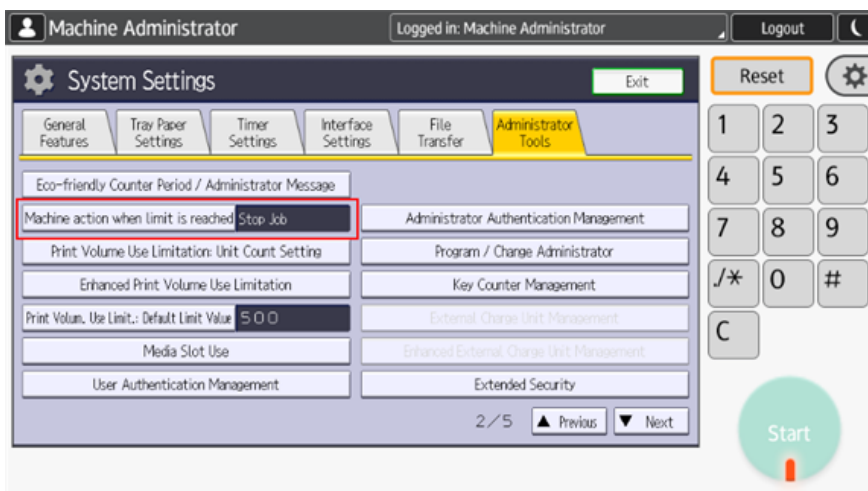
6. Tap **System Settings**. The System Settings screen opens.



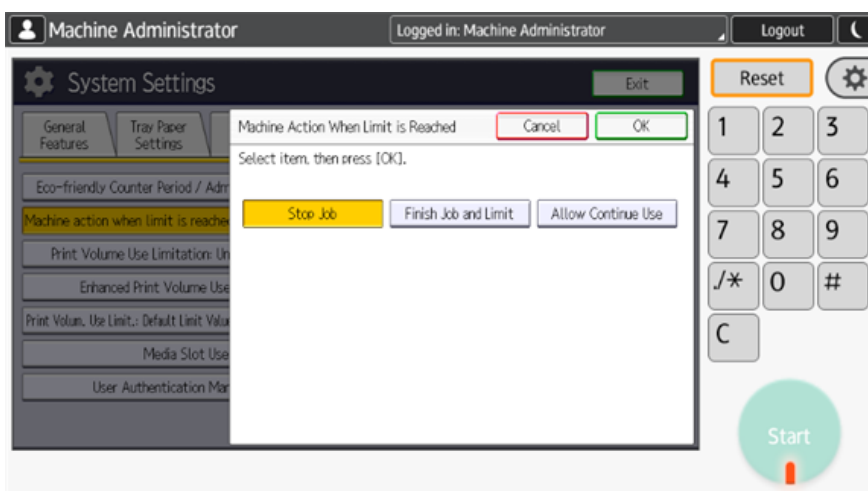
7. Tap **Administrator Tools**. The Administrator Tools tab opens.



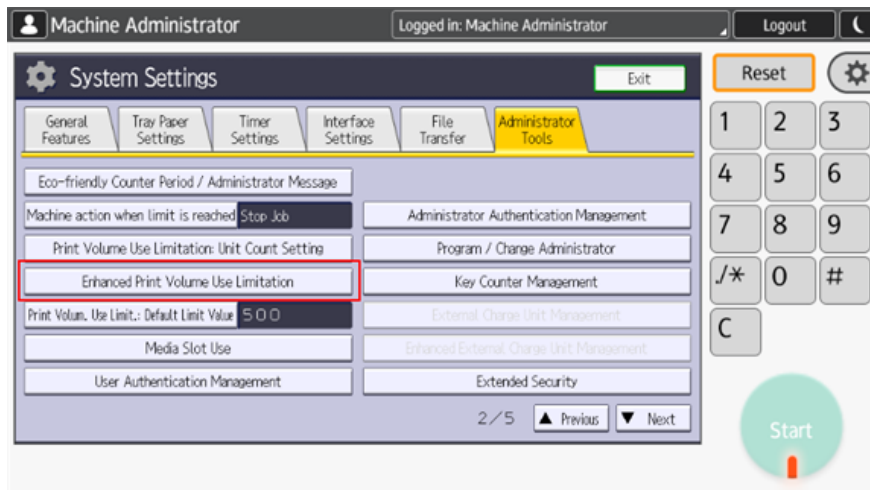
8. Tap **Machine action when limit is reached**. The Machine Action When Limit is Reached dialog box appears.



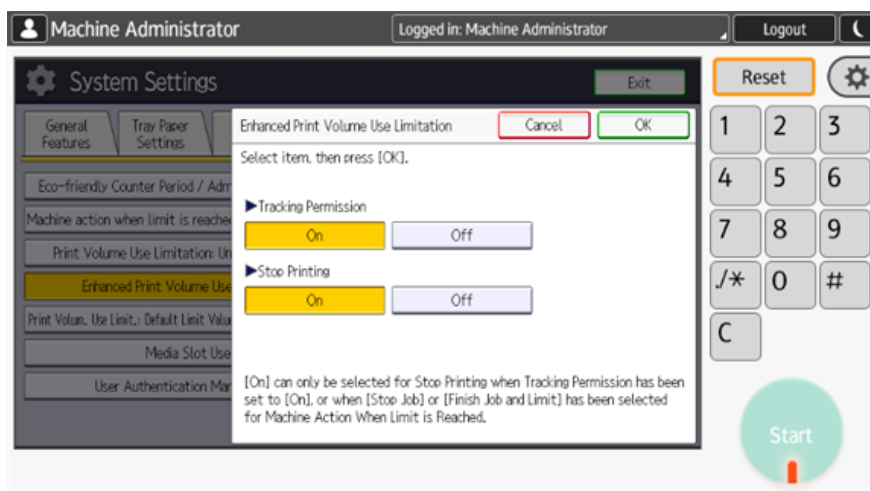
9. In the dialog box, select the **Stop Job** option, and then tap **OK** at the top-right corner of the screen. You are returned to the Administrator Tools tab.



10. On the tab, tap **Enhanced Print Volume Use Limitation**. The Enhanced Print Volume Use Limitation dialog box appears.



11. In the dialog box, set **Tracking permission** and **Stop Printing** to **On**, and then tap **OK** at the top-right corner.

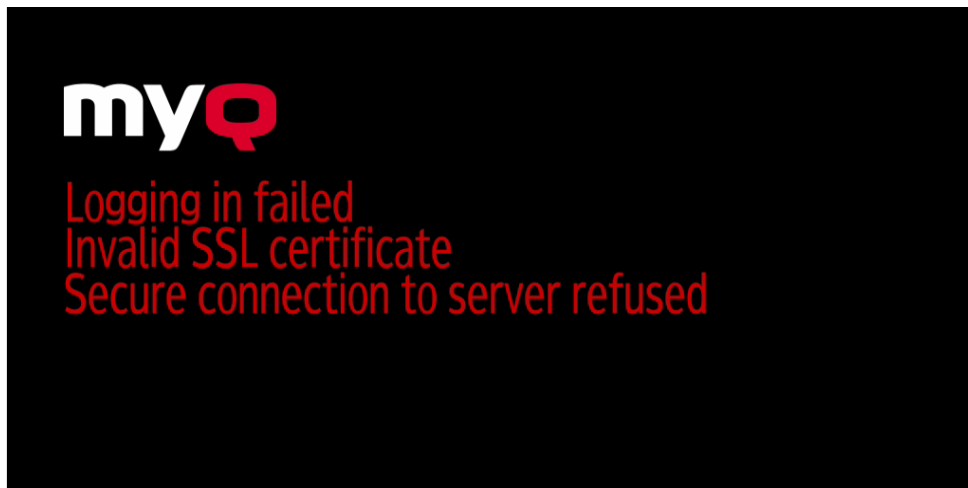


12. Restart the printing device.

3.4 Communication Security

The SSL certificate is installed automatically during the remote setup.

In the case that incorrect SSL certificates are used, the *"Logging in failed - Invalid SSL certificate - Secure connection to server refused"* message is displayed after a login attempt.



Once you change the certificate on the server, a force remote configuration is required. After the force reconfiguration, a device reboot might also be required.

- For proper behavior, it is important to configure time settings (time zone, and date and time settings) of the device to the same values as the server.

In the case that *IP address* is used for the terminal's installation instead of the *server's hostname* in your Configuration profile and **Allow unsecure communication** is disabled in MyQ Easy Config, the IP address of the server has to be added as a **Server alternative name** in the **Communication Security** settings in the MyQ web administrator interface:

4. After the changes are saved, a force configuration, printer re-activation, and a device reboot are required in order to apply the updated certificate.

3.5 Changing Login Methods

If you want to change login methods after the installation, you need to edit the configuration profile and reactivate your printer(s).

You can choose between two types of login: simple login and two-step authentication. With the simple login option, you can select up to three methods of login, and with the two-step authentication, you can select a combination of the login methods.

To change the login type:

1. In the MyQ Web administrator interface, go to **MyQ, Settings, Configuration Profiles**.
2. Select the profile you want to change and click **Edit** on the main ribbon (or right-click and **Edit**, or double-click). Choose the login method in the pane to the right.
3. Click **Save**. A pop-up window tells you that you need to activate the printers again.
4. Click **OK** if you want to re-activate all the printers connected to this profile, or click **Skip** if you only want to change the settings for specific printers.
5. If you chose to skip, go to **MyQ, Printers** to open the **Printers** overview. Select the printer(s) to change, right-click and select **Activate**.
6. Restart the printing device(s).

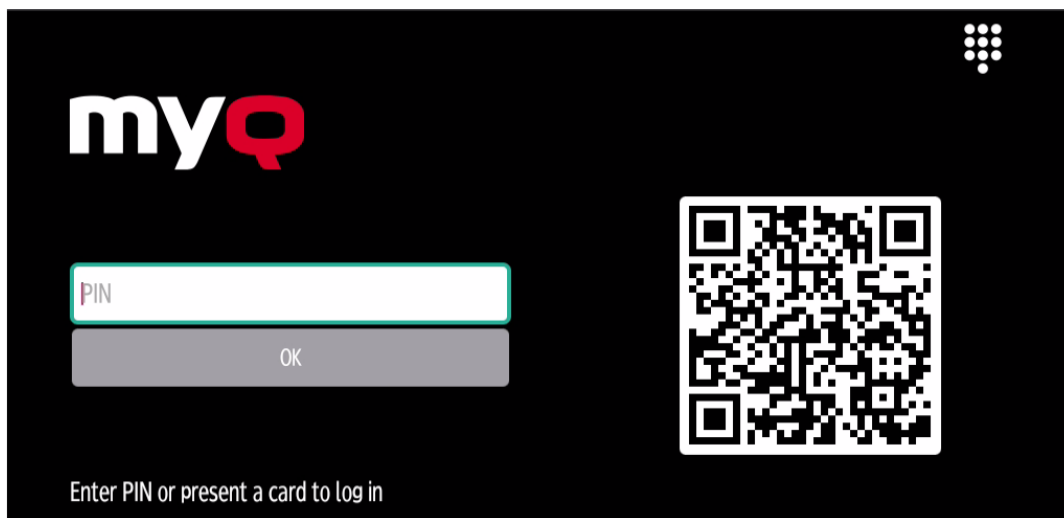
3.5.1 Login via QR code

In **MyQ, Settings, Printers & Terminals**, in the **Mobile Application** section, you can **Enable login by QR code on terminal login screen**. Once enabled, a switch for changing between the QR code and the keyboard is displayed on the terminal screen.

It is also possible to configure displaying a QR code on the terminal, instead of the numeric keyboard, by default. Mark the checkbox next to **Set QR code as default login method** and click **Save**.



After the confirmation, a QR code is displayed as the default login option on the terminal.

3.6 Selecting Languages

The language selected as the default one on the MyQ server is also used on all the embedded terminals. You can change the language that will be used on individual user sessions on the terminals.

The default language:

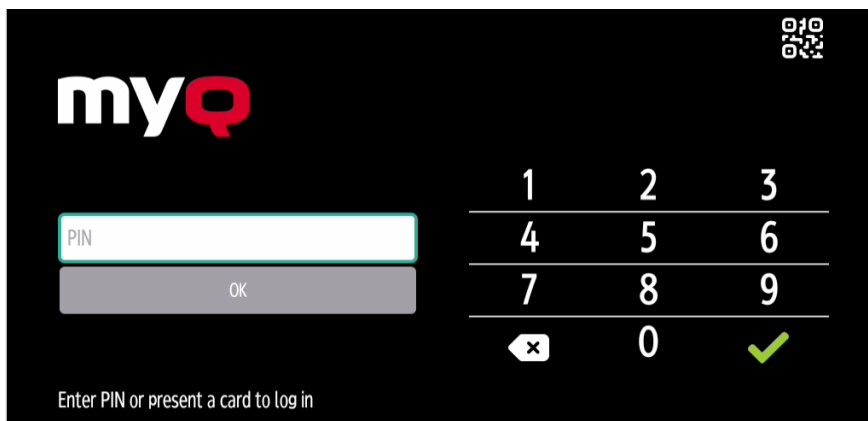
3.7 Activating Card Readers

To activate a USB card reader:

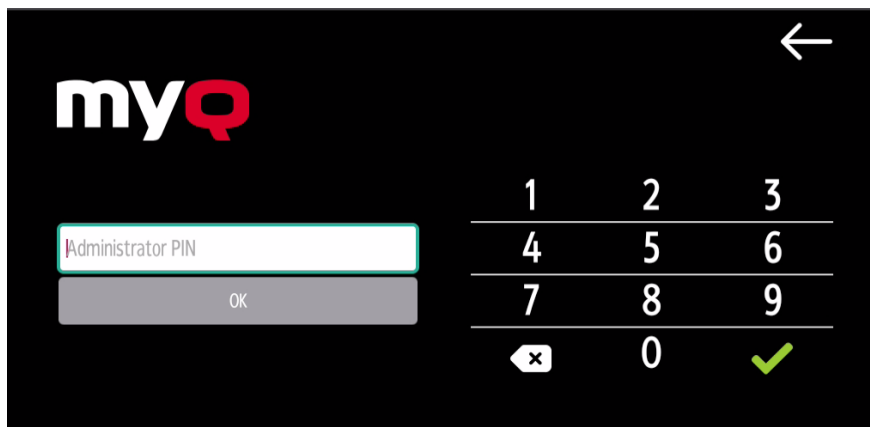
- Register it on the printing device's touch panel
- Add the card reader's **Vendor ID** and **Product ID** to the USB device list on the printing device's Web UI.

3.7.1 Registering the card reader on the printing device's touch panel

1. On the initial screen of the MyQ Embedded application, tap **MyQ** to open the admin login screen.



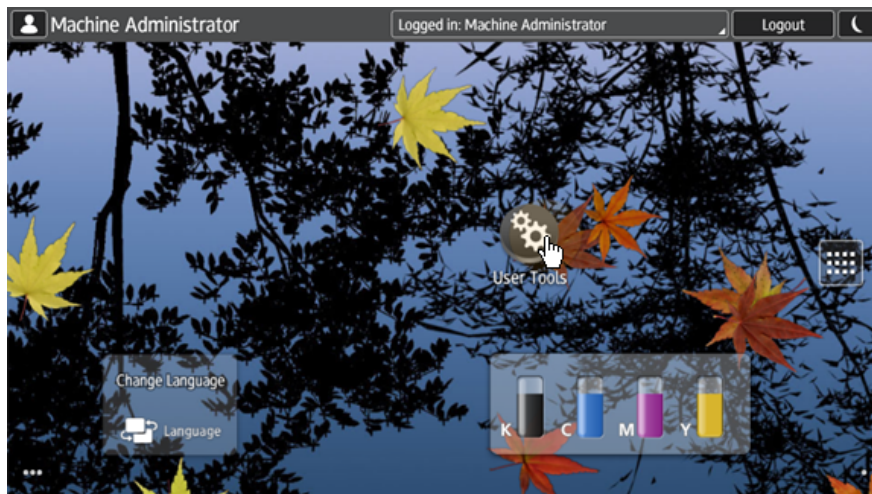
2. On the admin login screen, enter the admin password (the default password is **1087**), and then tap **OK**. The Admin menu opens.



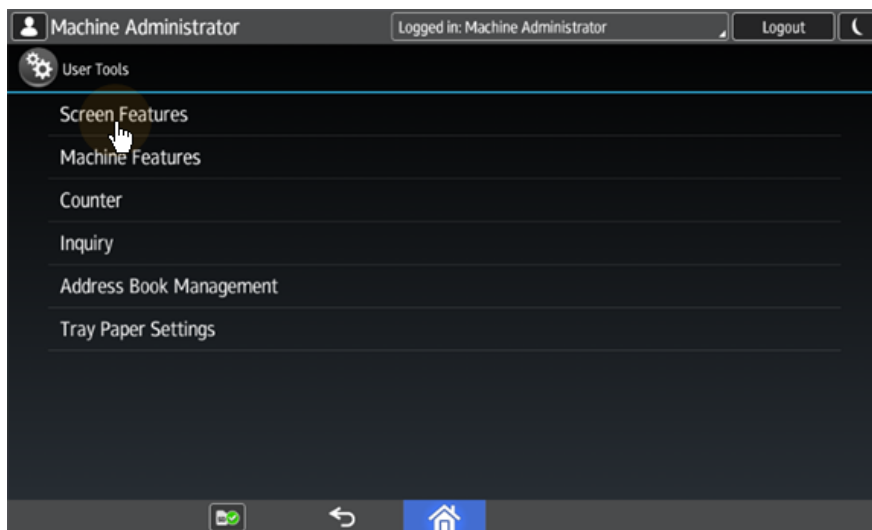
3. Tap **Admin Login** for opening the device's panel screen.



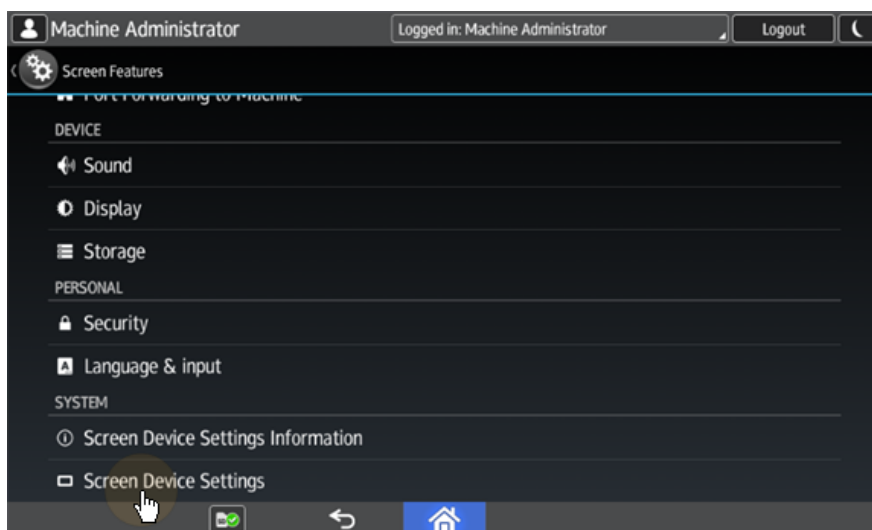
4. On the screen, tap **User Tools**. The User Tools screen opens.



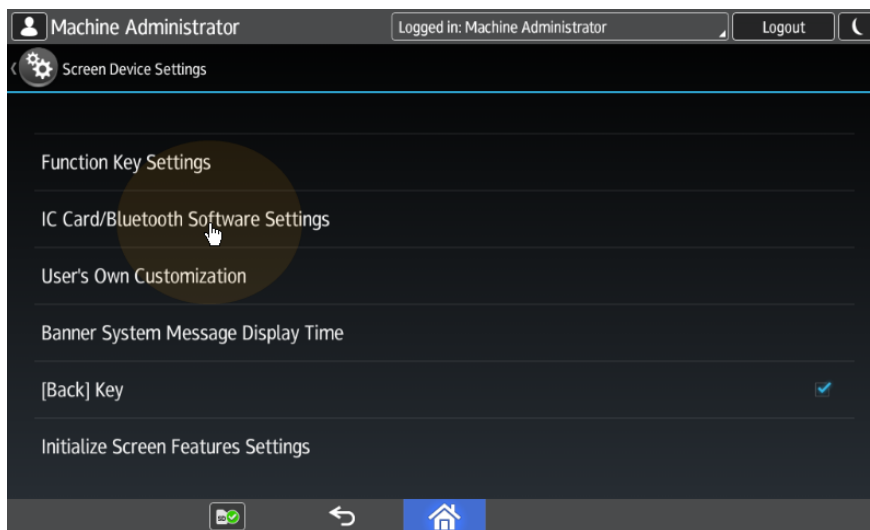

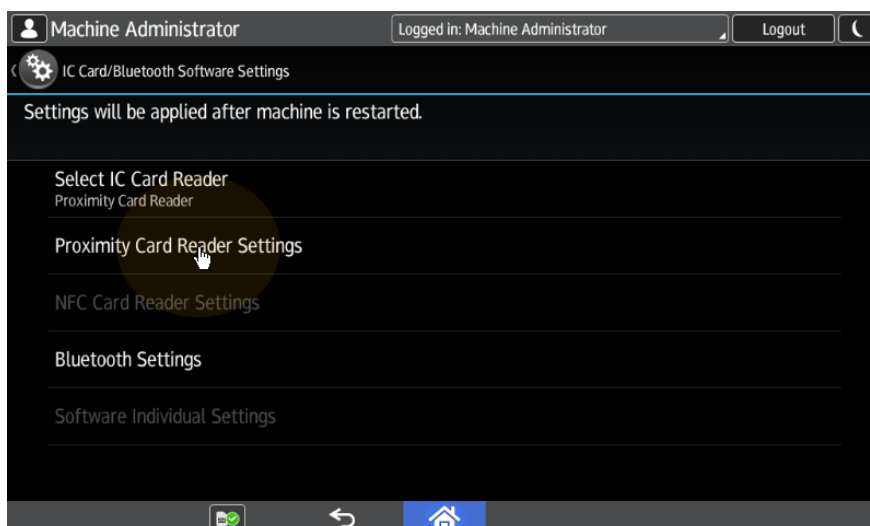
8. Tap **Select IC Card Reader**. The Select IC Card Reader dialog box appears.



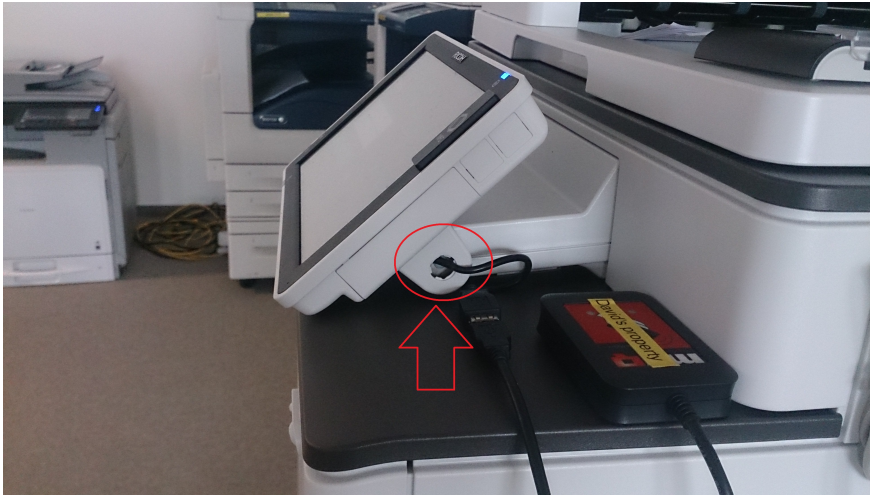
9. Tap **Proximity Card Reader**. The dialog box is closed.



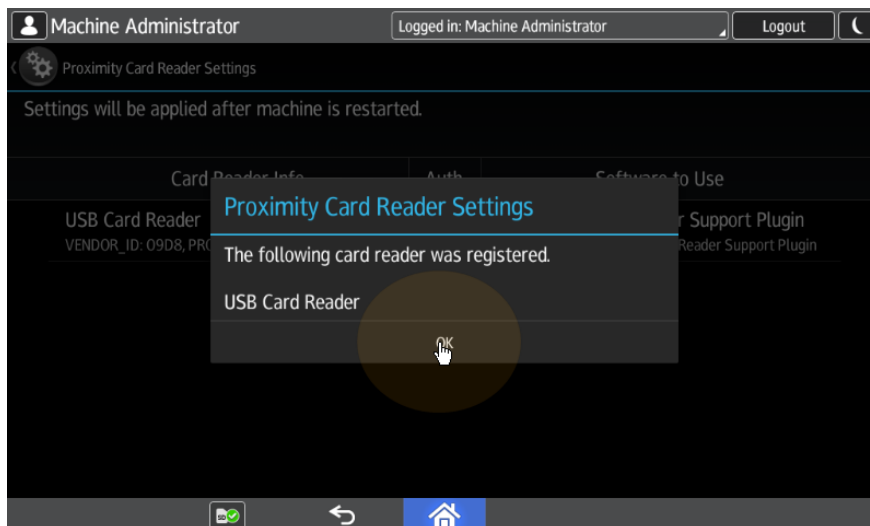

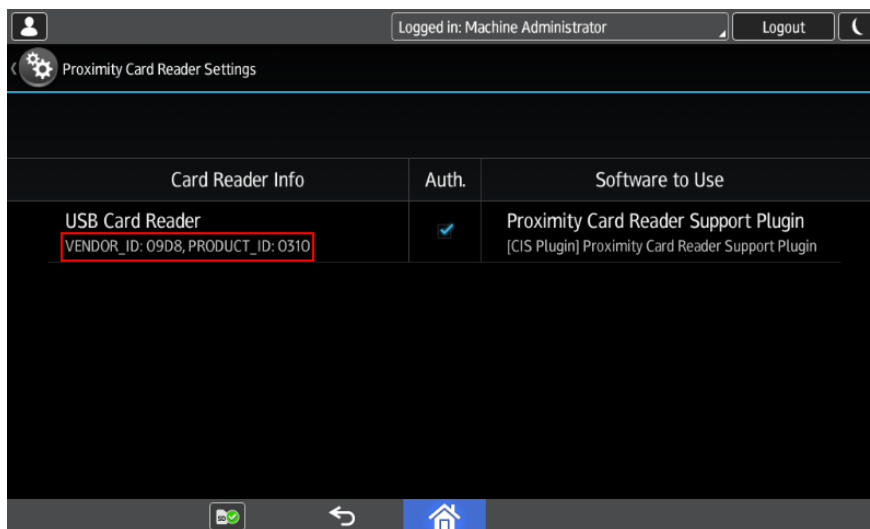
11. Plug in the card Reader to the Android panel via Mini USB — USB (female) reduction. The Proximity Card Reader Settings message box informs you that a USB card reader was registered.



12. Tap **OK** to close the Proximity Card Reader Settings message box.



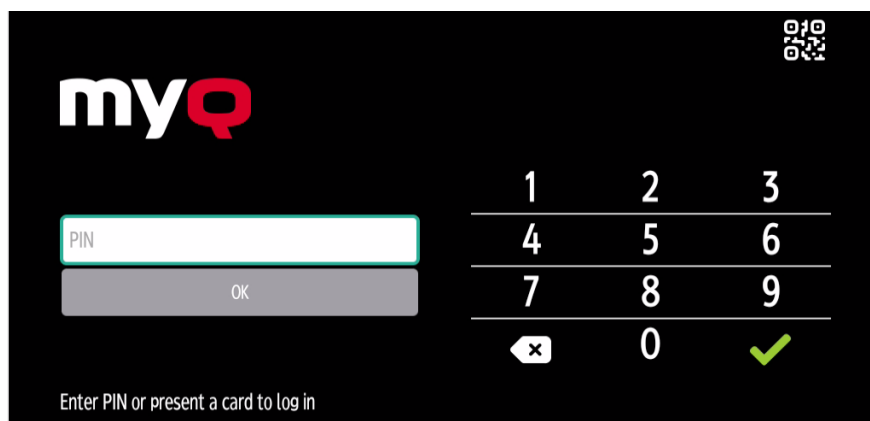
13. Back on the Proximity Card Reader Settings screen, remember (write down) the **VENDOR_ID** number and the **PRODUCT_ID** number displayed under **Card Reader Info**. These numbers have to be added to the printing device USB device list.



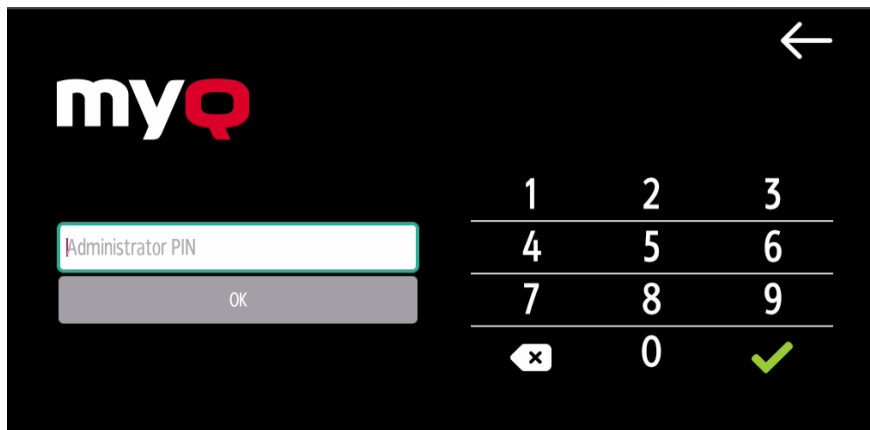
14. Exit the system settings.

For some newer devices, the system menu is different. Here are the steps in the updated system menu.

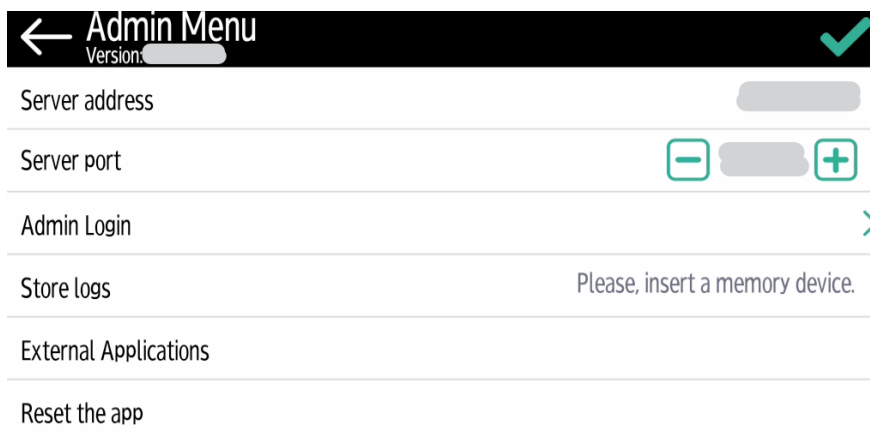

3.7.2 Adding the Card Reader on the Device's Web UI

To add the card reader's **Vendor ID** and **Product ID** to the USB device list on the printing device's web UI:

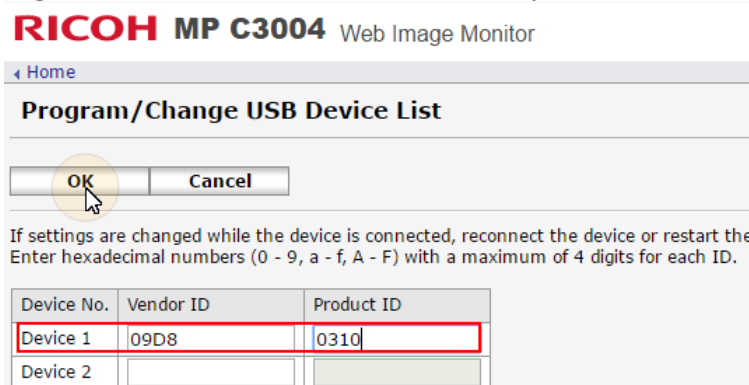
1. On the menu on the left side of the device's web UI, point on **Device Management**, and then click **Configuration**. The Configuration tab opens.



2. On the tab, under **Device Settings**, click **Program/Change USB Device List**. The Program/Change USB Device List tab opens.

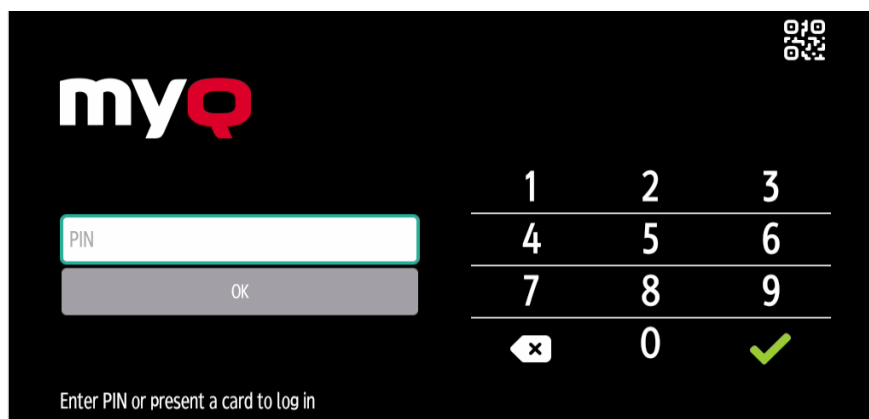


- On the Program/Change USB Device List tab, on the list of USB devices, enter the card reader's **Vendor ID** and **Product ID** that you wrote down during the registration, and then click **OK** at the top-left corner of the tab.

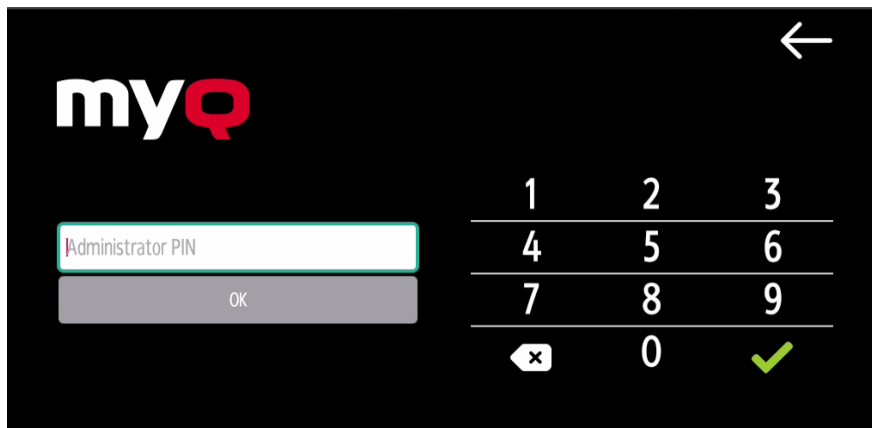

3.8 Update and Uninstallation

Updating the terminal

Updating the terminal is done on the MyQ web administrator interface.

 Check [Terminal packages](#) in the MyQ Print Server guide for further details.

 If you are upgrading from version 7.5 to version 10.1 and you have previously [configured PjL header parameters](#) on your 7.5 installation, **remove the PjL configuration before upgrading to 10.1**. If not removed, your 10.1 installation will not work correctly.

 For older MyQ Server or terminal packages versions, **Delete** the installed terminal package, and **+Add** the latest one.

Uninstalling the terminal

MyQ embedded terminals can be uninstalled on the MyQ Web Administrator interface or by forcing a factory reset on the printing device. In the first case, even if the terminal is uninstalled, all of the device settings can be preserved for future use, whereas after a device reset, all the settings are lost and the device returns to its default factory state.

To remotely uninstall an embedded terminal from the MyQ Web administrator interface, follow the steps below. Before the uninstallation, make sure that the Ricoh installation package is uploaded on the server and the Ricoh service is running.

Go to **MyQ, Settings, Configuration Profiles**. Choose the profile and click **Edit** (or double-click, or right click and **Edit**). The properties panel opens on the right side. In the **Terminal** tab, change the **Terminal type** to **None**. Click **Save**.

4 Licenses

The total number of embedded terminals that can run at the same time is equal to the number allowed by the embedded terminal licenses. If the number of embedded licenses at the server is exhausted, the terminal is deactivated. As a result, users cannot log in to this terminal and the **Login failed/Access denied** message appears on the terminal.



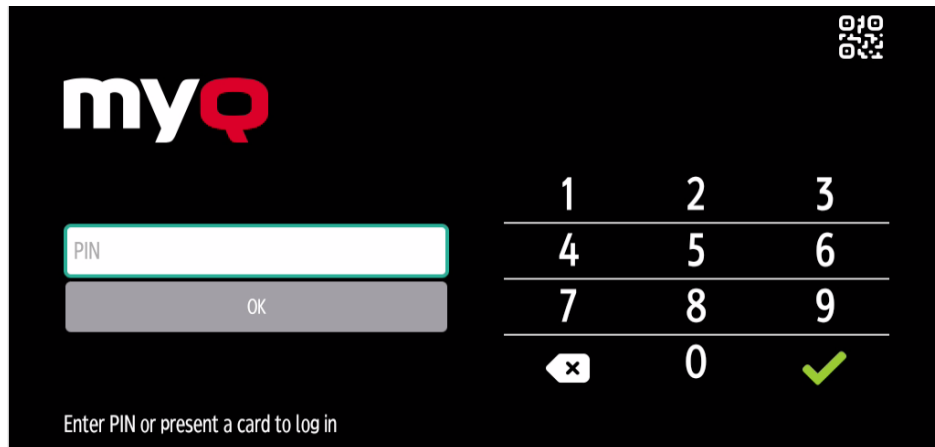
To regain access to the terminal, you can add a new license or deactivate one of the currently activated terminals and then, reactivate the printing device on the MyQ Web administrator interface.

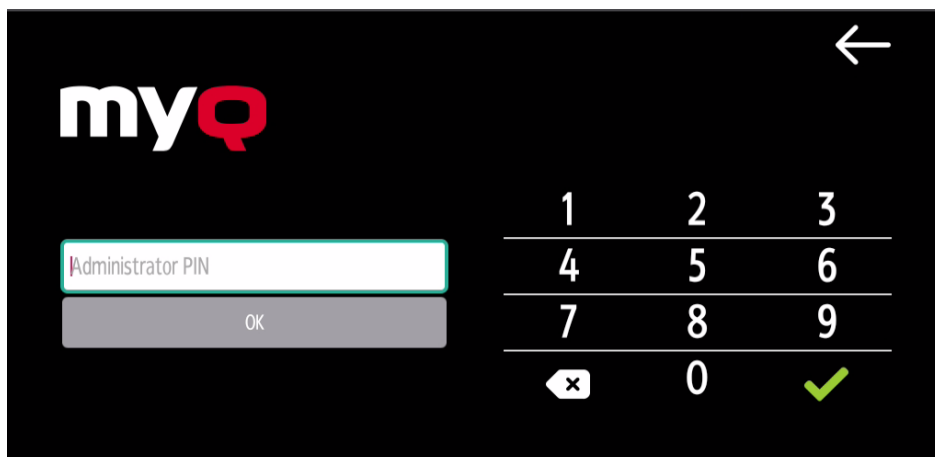
5 Admin Menu

From the terminal's **Admin Menu**, you can administer the terminal and the device. The available actions are **Admin Login**, **Store logs**, and **Reset the app**.

On the initial screen of the MyQ Embedded application, tap the **MyQ** logo to open the admin login screen.



On the admin login screen, enter the admin password (the default password is **1087**), and then tap **OK**.

Admin Login

Unlocks the printing device's panel; with the panel unlocked, the printing device's default screen opens, and all the device features are accessible. Pages printed and scanned in this mode are accounted to the ***unauthenticated** user.

Once the panel is unlocked, the device setup can be accessed by pressing the **System menu** button on the device's operation panel.

When you open the device's panel using the **Admin Login** button, you are automatically granted administrative rights to all its settings.

Exporting the Log

If MyQ Support asks you to provide the embedded terminal's log, you can do so using a USB Flash drive or the SD Card memory.

To export the terminal log, insert the USB Flash drive/SD Card on the device and tap **Store logs** on the Admin Menu.

The log file is exported and uploaded to the USB/SD Card.

6 Personalization

On the **Personalization** settings tab in the MyQ Web administrator interface, under **Terminal personalization**, you can add a **Custom Logo** and select a different **Theme** to change the overall appearance of your Embedded terminal.



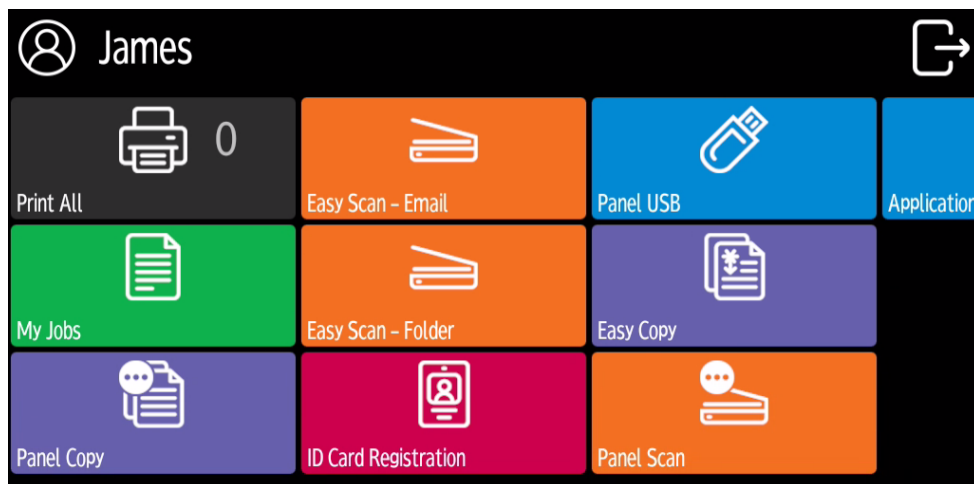

7.1 Print all

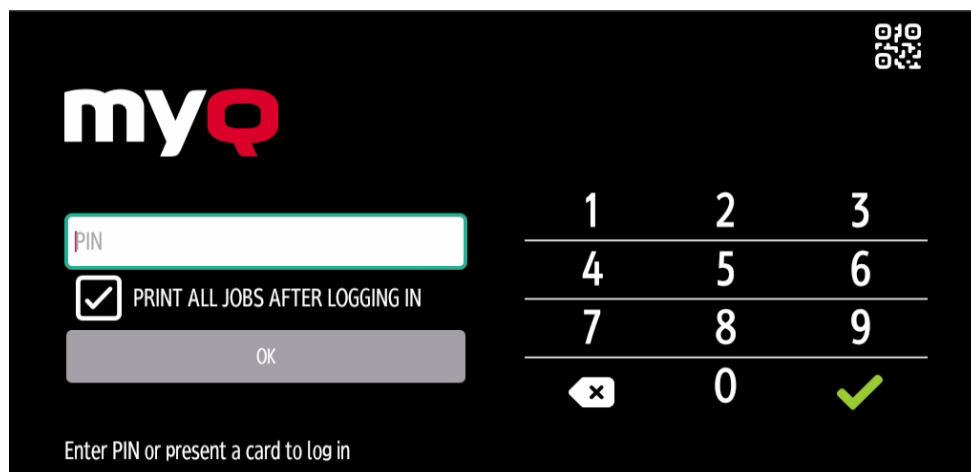
This action prints all jobs that are waiting in queue in the Ready and Paused states, including jobs delegated by other users.

7.1.1 Print all jobs after logging in

As an alternative to the **Print All** terminal action, you can use the **Print all jobs after logging in** feature. Once enabled on the **Printers** settings tab, under **General**, all the user's jobs are printed immediately after they log in to an embedded terminal. This way, the user does not have to tap the **Print all** button to print the jobs.

Even if the **Print all jobs after logging in** option is selected on the server, users can disable the feature on the embedded terminal before they log in. This way, each user can individually decide if they want to print the jobs automatically or manually via the **Print all** button.

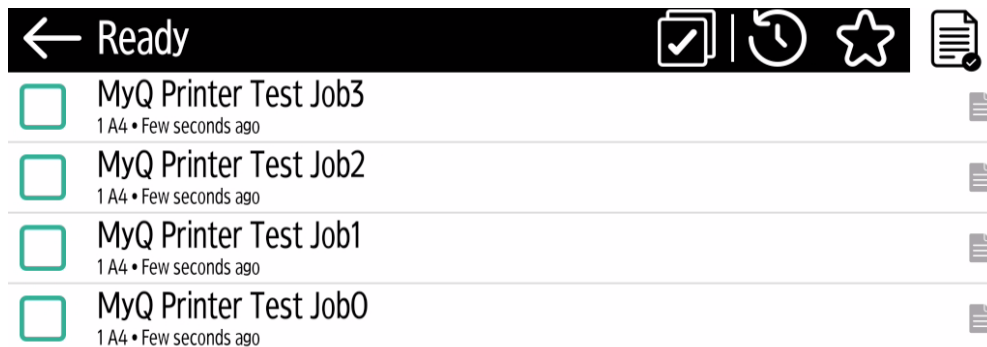
If the user disables the feature on the terminal and does not login in 30 seconds, the terminal screen refreshes with the **Print all jobs after logging in** option selected.



7.2 My Jobs

This terminal action shows all the jobs that can be printed on the printing device. Users can manage their ready, favorite, and printed jobs here.

- **Ready jobs:** This is the initial tab of the **My Jobs** screen. It can be reopened by tapping the page icon at the upper-left corner of the screen. It contains jobs waiting in queue, ready to be printed.
- **Favorite jobs:** Favorite jobs can be displayed by tapping the **star** icon at the upper-left corner of the screen. It contains a list of jobs you have marked as favorites.
- **Printed jobs:** Printed jobs can be displayed by tapping the **clock** icon at the upper-left corner of the screen. It contains a history of your printed jobs.



Job Filters

In the MyQ Web administrator interface, in **MyQ, Settings, Printers & Terminals**, under the **General** section, it is possible to **Allow a color job on a B&W printer**, but the job is accounted as B&W. This option is disabled by default.

If a job is not allowed to be printed because the selected format/color is not supported by the device, there will be a red exclamation mark icon next to the job. Clicking the icon displays the reason for the error:

- *Color jobs cannot be printed on this device*, when a color job is spooled to a B&W printer.
- *A3 jobs cannot be printed on this device*, when an A3 job is spooled to an A4 printer.
- *Neither color nor jobs in this format can be printed on this device*, when an A3 and color job is spooled to an A4 and B&W printer.

Managing jobs on the My Jobs screen

To display the available job management options, select the job from the list. The selected print jobs management bar opens at the top of the screen.



On the bar, you can select from the following options:

- **Print:** Tap the printer icon to print the selected jobs.
- **Edit:** Tap the edit icon to edit the print options of the selected jobs. In the **Print options** dialog box, depending on the permissions given by the administrator, the user can select between color or B/W, simplex/duplex

options, set stapling and punching, and change the number of copies. After changing the print options, the user can tap the printer icon to print the jobs.

i In certain cases, you may see listed some print options that are not applicable due to the queue or printer being used. For example, you may see **Staple** options despite printing on a terminal with no stapling feature. In cases such as these, this command will be ignored.

- **Job Preview:** Tap the eye icon to preview the selected jobs.
- **Add to favorites:** Tap the star-plus icon to add the selected jobs to your favorites (Visible on the Ready jobs tab and on the Printed jobs tab).
- **Delete from favorites:** Tap the star-minus icon to delete the selected jobs from your favorites (Visible on the Favorite jobs tab).
- **Delete:** Tap the bin icon to delete the selected jobs.

Job Preview

The **Job Preview** feature is used to generate previews of jobs. To enable it, go to **MyQ, Settings, Jobs, Job Preview**. It is possible to limit the **Number of pages** to be generated (1 by default) in the preview. To include all the pages, set the value to 0.

Once enabled, the Job Preview (eye) button is visible on the terminal.

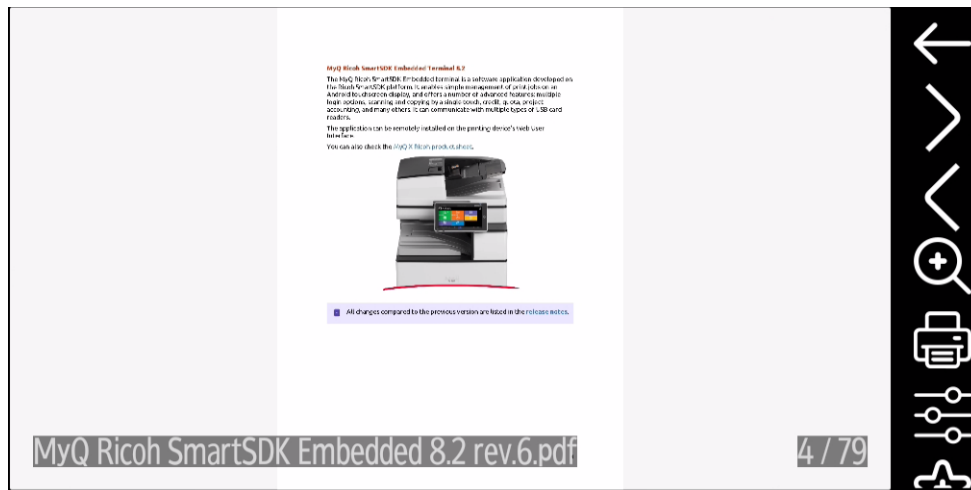

Tapping on it redirects to the Job Preview screen. The first page of the document is displayed by default in a thumbnail view, as the first page of the job preview. Alongside the document's preview, you can also see the document's name in the lower-left corner, the number of pages in the lower-right corner, and the navigation menu to the right side.



In the navigation menu, you can use the back button to return to My Jobs, the forward and backwards buttons to preview more pages, the magnifying glass button to zoom in and out of the previewed page, the printer button to print the job or open the job's print options, and the three-dots button to expand the navigation menu. In the expanded menu, you can delete the job, add the job to your favorites, and print the job.

Job Roaming

The **Job Roaming** feature enables users to transfer their jobs from one location to another: jobs sent to one branch can be printed on printing devices at any other branch.

The user can download a job only to one site at the same time. A MyQ Central server with Site servers is required for this feature. For more information, see the *MyQ Central Server Installation* guide.

To print the jobs, the user has to take the following steps:

1. Log in to the embedded terminal.
2. Tap **My Jobs**. The My Jobs screen opens.
3. On the screen, tap the globe icon. The Remote tab opens.
4. Select the jobs to be downloaded, and tap the download icon at the top-right corner of the tab. The jobs are downloaded and can be printed on the current printing device, as well as on any other printing device attached to the **Job Roaming** queue.

7.3 Easy Scan

Scanning by a single touch. After the user taps this action, the page is immediately scanned to a predefined destination. You can define multiple destinations where the scanned document is sent to, and set scan parameters in MyQ.

 For information on how to configure the **Easy Scan** action and define its destinations and parameters, check [Easy Scan settings](#) in the MyQ Print Server guide.

- If enabled on the server, users can change their scan settings from the terminal screen.

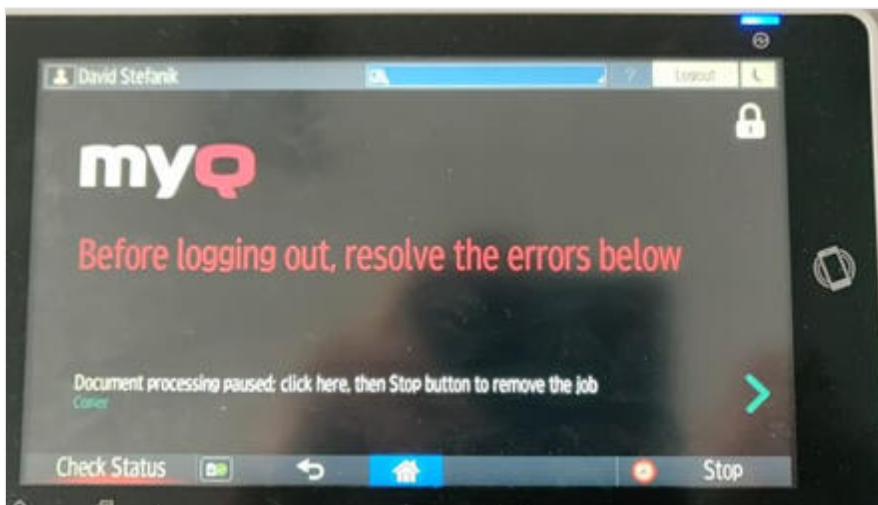

 - Off

7.3.2 Logging out while scanning

1. Ricoh does not allow users to log out when a scanning or copying job is running.
2. When the user tries to log out, the scan job must be cancelled or finished first.
3. The same is true when a device error (like paper jam) occurs; the device error must be fixed first, the scan job cancelled or finished, and only then can the user log out.

4. In such cases, the following is displayed on the terminal's screen, in red: **Before logging out, resolve the errors below.**
5. The screen also displays a list of jobs along with their errors that need to be resolved first.
6. To resolve the error, one has to tap on the error message, and then tap on the **Stop** button (located in the right-bottom corner).
7. The user must not tap on the **Stop** button sooner nor later, and nothing should be tapped in-between.
8. Once the **Stop** button is tapped, follow the related instructions on the screen, for example, confirm cancelling the job.
9. Once the job is cancelled, the user can log out.
10. See the below video with an example of an error, how to stop the job, and then log out.



7.4 Easy Print

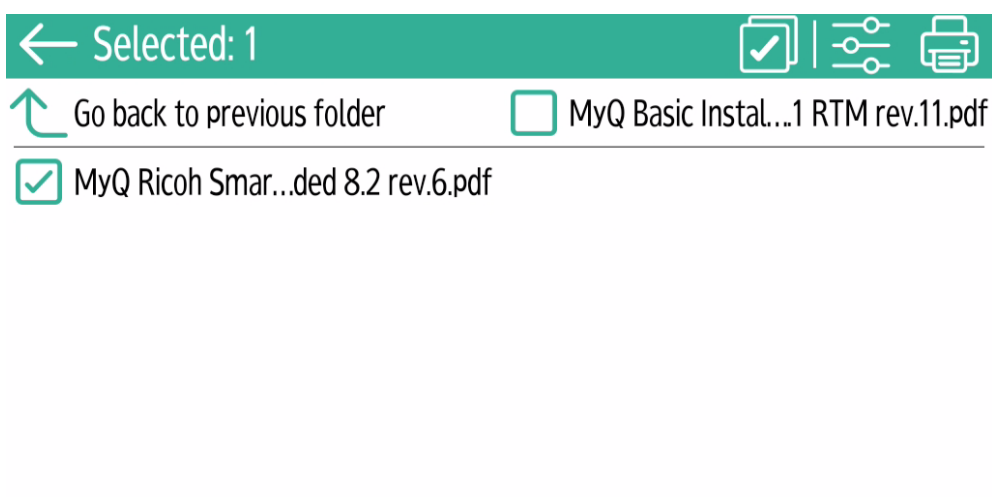
The Easy Print terminal action allows users to print files without sending them to MyQ first. These files can be printed from multiple destinations, like several cloud storages, network or local drives, and the user's default storage.

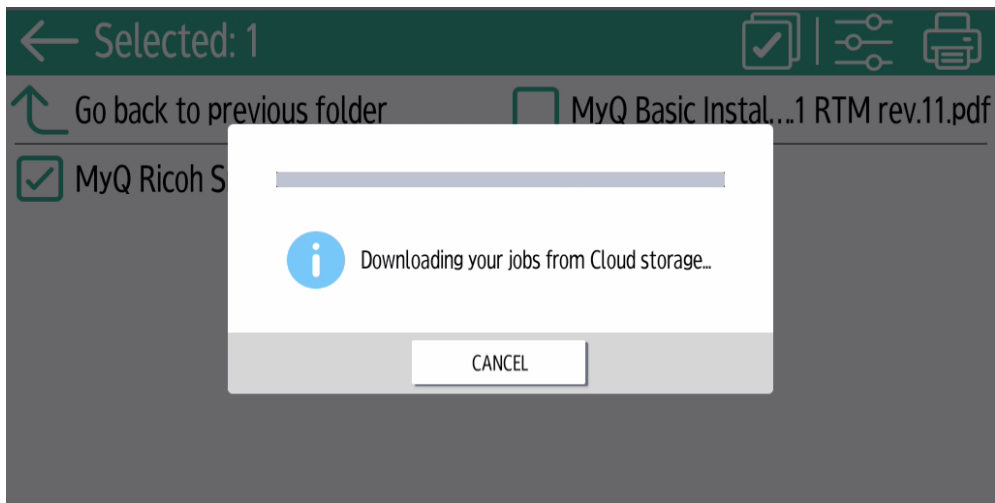
For information on how to configure the **Easy Print** action, check [Easy Print settings](#) in the MyQ Print Server guide.

When Easy Print is used on the terminal, the user is presented with a list of possible destinations associated with this action (this is skipped in case of a single destination). After the destination is selected, the user can browse it and select files for printing.



After pressing the print button, the files are downloaded from the destination to the server, processed through the default Easy Print queue, and released immediately to the printer without any further interaction. It is also possible to cancel the whole downloading and printing process. In this case, files that have already been downloaded, but not printed, are deleted from the server. Files that have already been printed remain on the server and it is possible to reprint them.





If the user does not have any Cloud storages connected, an information message appears on the terminal informing the user that there is no Cloud storage available but can be set up in the web UI.



7.5 Easy Copy

One tap copying. After the user taps this action, the page is immediately copied.

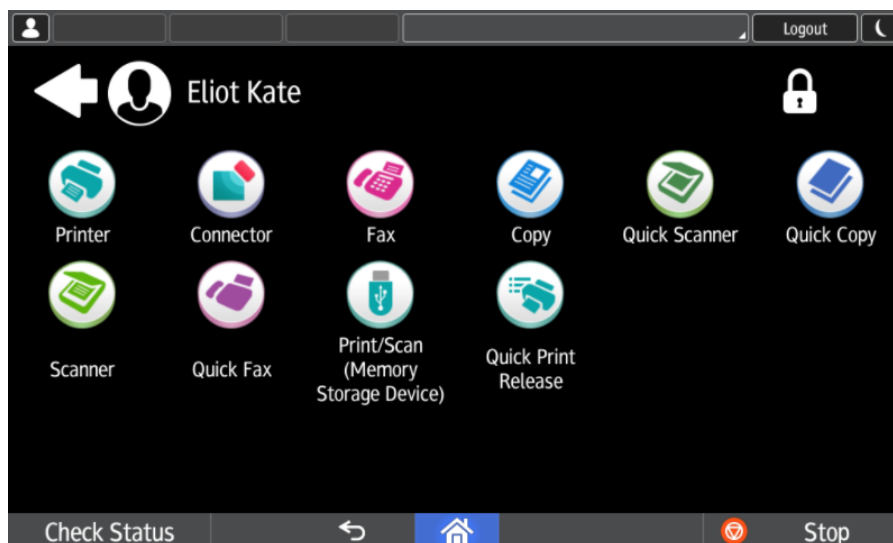

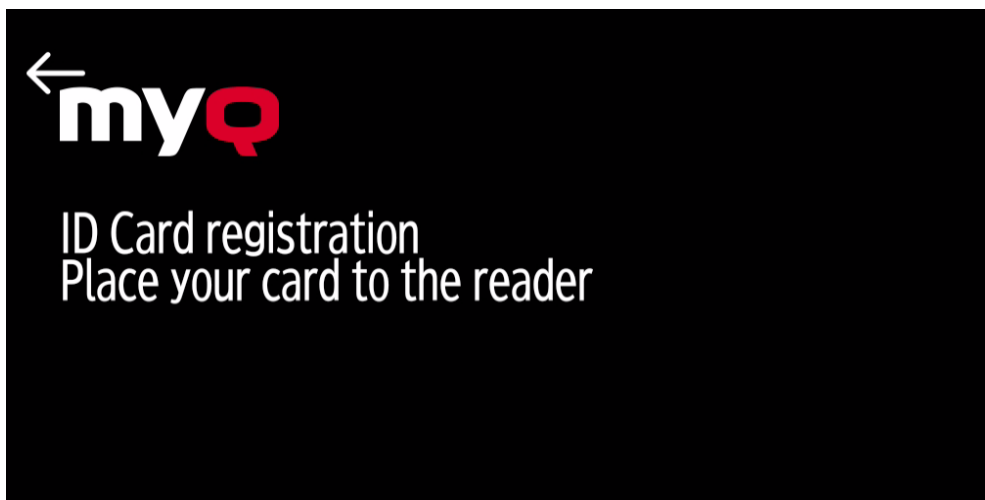

7.12 Folders

Terminal actions can be put into folders. Folders can be used to optimize the layout of the terminal screen or to enable users to access a larger number of actions. For example, you can place multiple Easy Scan actions with different destinations under one Easy Scan folder. Another example is to leave the most important terminal actions on the home screen and place the rest into an *additional actions* folder.

Empty folders are not displayed on the terminal screen. If there is only one item in the folder, the item is displayed instead of the folder.

7.13 ID Card Copy

By tapping this action, users can create a copy, where both sides of an ID card are printed on a single page.

They can set the following parameters:

- **Copies** - Number of printed copies.
- **Color** - Select from color, monochrome or gray scale.

8 Accounting

In the **Accounting** settings tab, in the **General** section, the MyQ administrator can set:

- the **Accounting mode** MyQ will be using:
 - **Accounting Group** - This is selected by default. In this mode, all quotas are available and can be spent.
 - **Cost Center** - In this mode, only the selected (cost center) payment account is spent.
- the **Payment account priority**, which applies to terminals that don't support user selection of payment accounts, and to direct queues without the MyQ Desktop Client option. The payment account with the highest priority is always used in such cases:
 - Credit
 - Quota

8.1 Credit

With credit accounting activated, users must have a sufficient amount of credit on their account to be allowed to print, copy and scan. On their home screen on the embedded terminal, they can view their remaining credit. If the **Recharge Credit** action is available on the terminal, users can recharge their credit by entering a code from a recharging voucher directly on any embedded terminal.

 If recharging credit by vouchers is enabled in MyQ, users without credit are asked to recharge after they log in. They are informed about the insufficient credit and automatically redirected to the **Recharge Credit** screen, where they can top up.

8.1.1 Recharging Credit

After tapping the **Recharge Credit** action, the Recharge Credit screen opens and the logged user can enter a recharge code from their voucher.

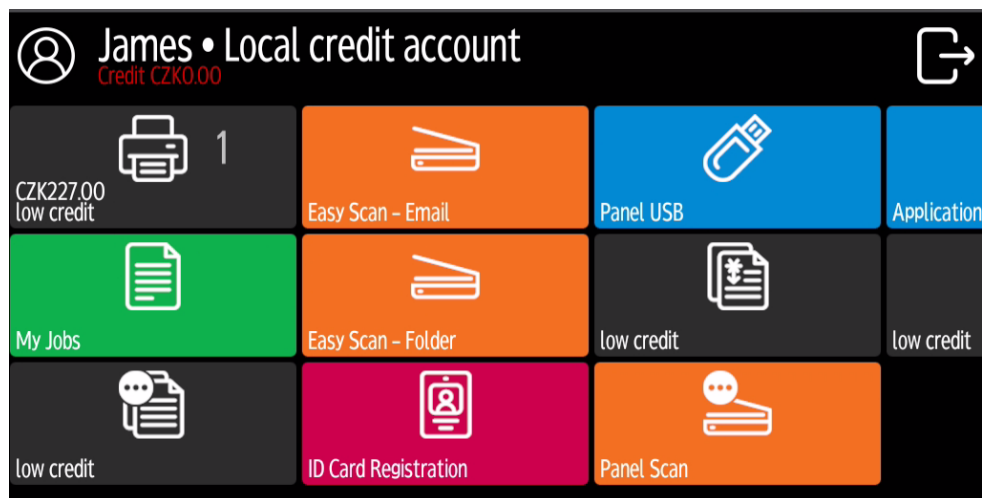

8.1.2 Using terminal actions with insufficient credit

If recharging credit by vouchers is enabled in MyQ, users can still see the actions that they do not have sufficient credit for. However, if they tap the particular action button, they are immediately redirected to the **Recharge Credit** screen.

If recharging credit by vouchers is disabled in MyQ and a user does not have sufficient credit, all actions requiring credit are unavailable, and their corresponding buttons are dimmed.



Action taken when a user runs out of credit during scanning via Easy Scan

The scan job is finished. The actual amount of credit is being updated throughout the scanning, and after the job is finished, no actions requiring credit can be used.

Action taken when a user runs out of credit during copying via Easy Copy

The copying is interrupted although a few more pages can be copied. The actual amount of credit is being updated throughout the copying and after the job is stopped, no actions requiring credit can be used.

Action taken when a user runs out of credit during scanning on the printing device scan panel

The user can scan as long as he or she stays on the scan panel. Once the panel is left, the actual amount of credit is shown and no actions requiring credit can be used.

Action taken when a user runs out of credit during copying on the printing device copy panel

The copying is interrupted although a few more pages can be copied. No more copies can be made on the panel and once it is left, the actual amount of credit is shown and no actions requiring credit can be used.

Print jobs with additional information from the job parser

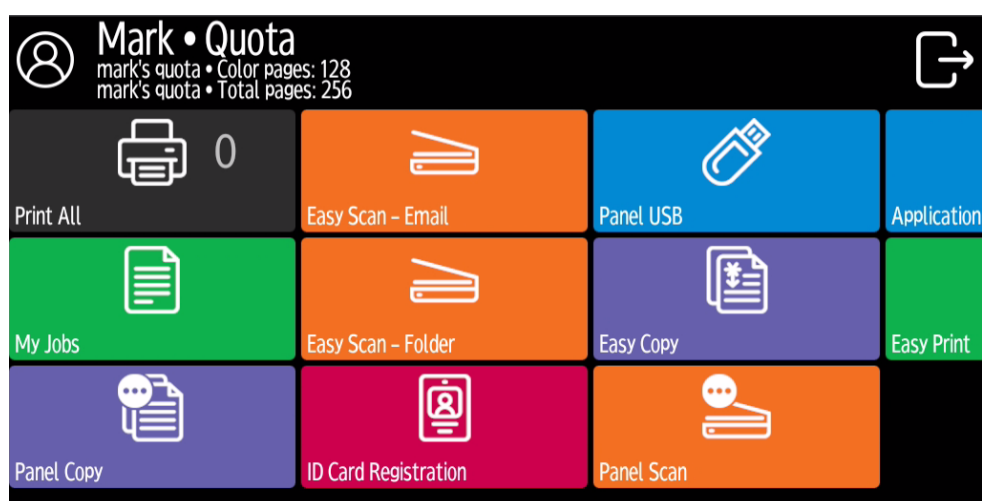

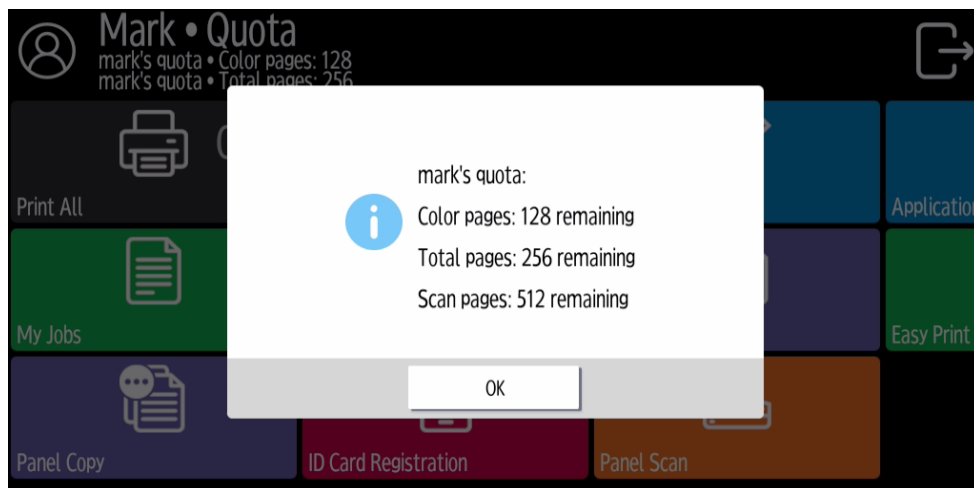

Priced jobs cannot be printed unless the users have a sufficient amount of credit. The users cannot use the **Print all** action when the overall price of all the priced print jobs is higher than their credit.

8.2 Quota

With the **Quota** feature activated, users cannot print, copy or scan after they reach or exceed their quota limit. They can view their current quotas on their session on the embedded terminal.





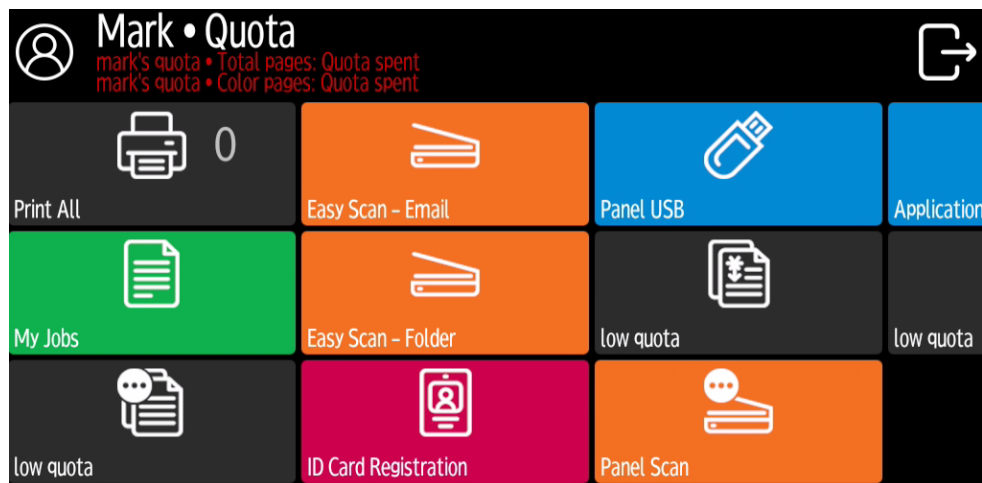
The embedded terminal's behavior depends on the quota settings in MyQ. When setting up **Quota** in the MyQ Web administrator interface, you can disable one or more operations after the quota is reached or exceeded:

- If the **Monitored value** is *Cost*, select them under **Disable operations**. The options are *Print*, *Copy*, *Color print* (on terminals 8.1 or newer), *Color copy* (on terminals 8.1 or newer), and *Scan*.
- If the **Monitored value** is *Pages*, mark the **Disable operation** checkbox and the operation that has reached the limit will be disabled.
- Mark the **Terminate the current job when reached** checkbox if you want to interrupt the current job when the quota is reached. If both **Disable operation** and **Terminate the current job when reached** are checked, the job will be interrupted when the quota is reached and the user will be redirected to the MyQ home screen. If **Disable operation** is checked and **Terminate the current job when reached** is not, the current job will be finished and the user will be redirected to the MyQ home screen. The action is not supported by scan quota.
- Quotas that disable scanning cannot be applied immediately.

Action taken when a user reaches a quota with immediate application

The current operation stops, although a few more pages can be printed or copied, depending on the printing device's speed. This applies to print and copy jobs only (including panel copy). Scan jobs are always finished.



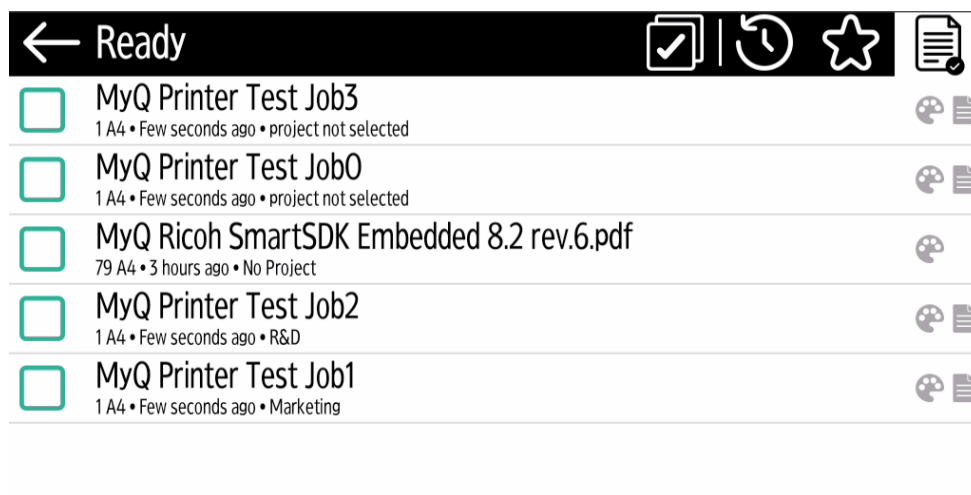
Print jobs with additional information from the job parser

Print jobs received with the job parser activated, include additional information such as number of pages, color and price.

Jobs exceeding the quota cannot be printed. Users cannot use the **Print all** action as long as the overall size of all of the print jobs is larger than what is allowed by the quota.

8.3 Projects

With the project accounting feature activated, users can assign projects to print, copy and scan jobs directly on the embedded terminal screen. Projects can also be assigned to print jobs in the MyQ Desktop Client pop-up window, on the MyQ Web administrator interface, or in the MyQ X Mobile Client.

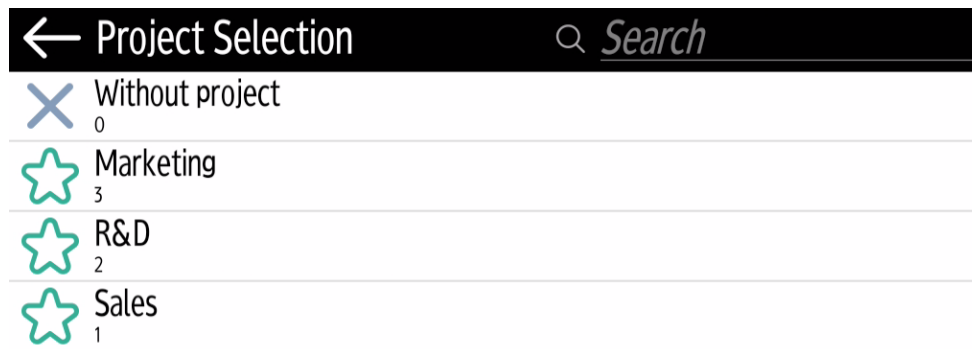

8.3.1 Assigning projects to print jobs

My Jobs

If a user wants to print an unassigned job from the **My Jobs** list, they are immediately redirected to the Project selection screen and have to select one of the available projects (or the *Without project* option, if printing without project is allowed) to be allowed to print it.



Jobs with projects assigned to them are immediately printed.

Print All

If all the jobs waiting in queue have projects already assigned by MyQ Desktop Client, MyQ Web administrator interface or the MyQ X Mobile Client, printing starts immediately.

If there are any unassigned jobs, the user is redirected to the Project selection screen, immediately after tapping the **Print All** button. They have to select one of the available projects (or the *Without project* option, if printing without project is allowed) to be allowed to print the jobs. The selected project (or the *Without project* option) is assigned only to unassigned jobs; all other jobs keep their previously assigned projects.

Assigning projects to Easy Copy jobs

After tapping the **Easy Copy** button, the user is immediately redirected to the Project selection screen where they need to select the project (or the *Without project* option).

Assigning projects to Easy Scan jobs

After tapping the **Easy Scan** button, the user is immediately redirected to the Project selection screen where they need to select the project (or the *Without project* option) before the scan job is started.

8.3.2 Assigning projects on the Panel Copy screen

After tapping the **Copy** button on the **Panel Copy** screen, the user is immediately redirected to the Project selection screen, where they need to select a project (or the *Without project* option). The project is then assigned to all jobs copied on the panel.

8.3.3 Assigning projects on the Panel Scan screen

After tapping the **Scan** button on the **Panel Scan** screen, the user is immediately redirected to the Project selection screen, where they need to select a project (or the *Without project* option). The project is then assigned to all jobs scanned on the panel.

8.3.4 Assigning projects on the Panel Fax screen

After tapping the **Fax** button on the **Panel Fax** screen, the user is immediately redirected to the Project selection screen, where they need to select a project (or the *Without project* option).

9 Device Spooling

Under normal circumstances, print jobs are sent to the MyQ server where they are stored and wait for release. With Device Spooling enabled, a print job is sent directly to the device and saved to its hard disk. It waits there to be released in the standard way.



- Locally spooled color jobs are not displayed when color print is restricted.
- Even though it is possible for a user to use both print to server and Device Spool, this option is not recommended. The following problems may appear: jobs are not sorted and printed in the correct order, the terminal display might not be correctly refreshed.

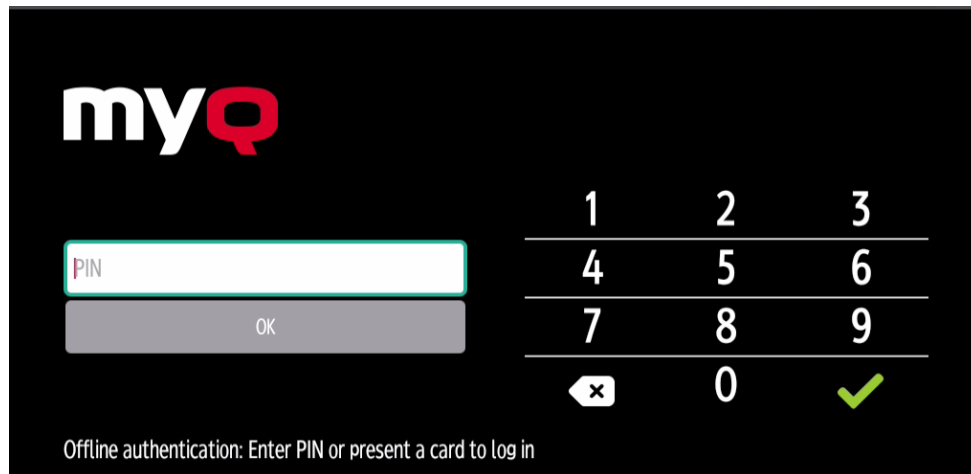
9.1 Setting up Device Spooling in MyQ

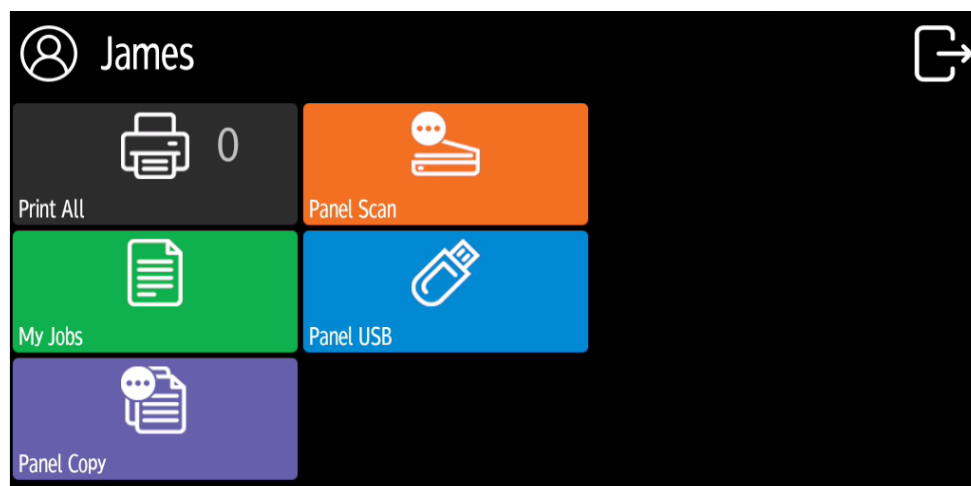
10 Offline Login

For MyQ to operate properly, a 100% reliable network connection is necessary. Connection problems can lead to serious issues; for example, users may not be able to start their user sessions on the printing devices and perform any copy, print or scan actions. The **Offline Login** feature prevents such situations.



User information, including credentials, are cached at the device and if the server is unavailable, cached data are used for user authentication. Users can then log in and perform all the actions that do not require network access to the MyQ server.

When combined with Device Spooling, the offline login feature offers a robust backup plan for server outages.



Requirements

- UDP broadcasts have to be enabled on the network.
- For an optimal run of the Offline Login feature, SSL needs to be enabled on the server. SSL is set by default during the installation, however if you have changed it for any reason, you can set it again in MyQ Easy Config, in the **Settings** tab.

Limitations

- Credit is not supported
- Quota is not supported;
- Projects - print jobs are set to the *Without Project* option

10.1 Scan to Email in Offline Login mode

You can enable users to scan to email even when the MyQ server is offline. In such cases, users can log in to the terminal in the Offline mode and use the **Panel Scan** action to scan to emails. The terminal remembers the outgoing SMTP server and sends all emails directly to this server. Scanning to email in the Offline mode is supported by all the models that support embedded terminals.

To enable the feature:

- Go to the printing device's Web UI and set your (customer) SMTP server's IP address in the **SMTP Server Name** field.

The *email@myq.local* and *root@myq.local* variables cannot be used in the Offline mode for scanning from the panel with these settings, because scanning is not done via the MyQ server.

11 Canceling Stuck Jobs

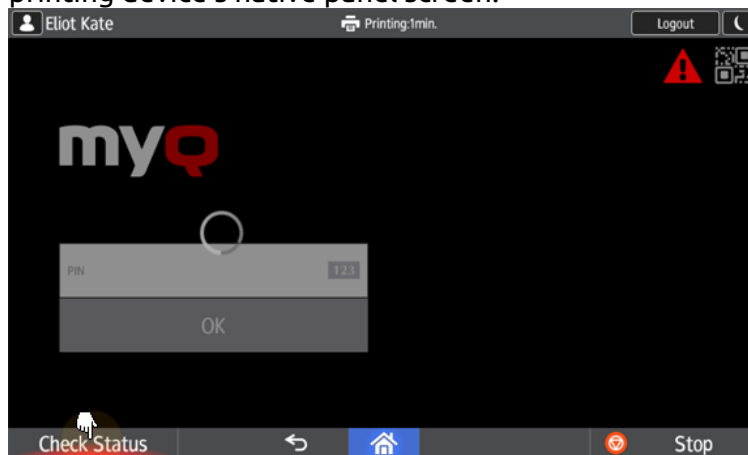
If a job gets stuck due to an error on the printing device, the user can still log off. The stuck job will prevent another user from logging in and will automatically finish after the error is removed. However, this may lead to security issues.

If a job is stuck, the **Check Status** control on the printing device's panel will glow red.

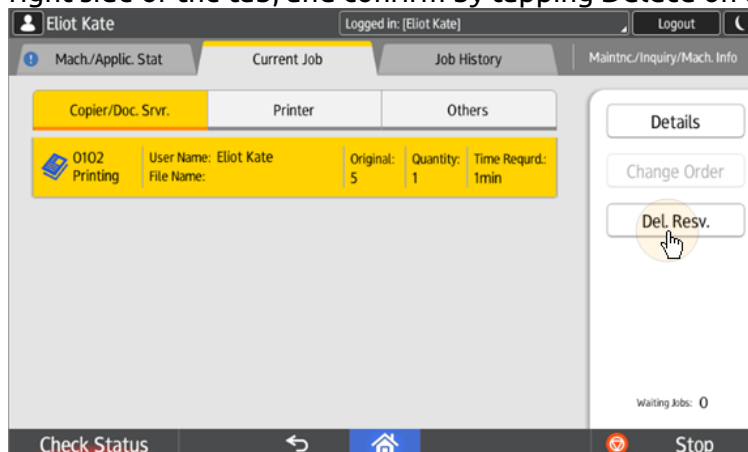
- If the **Keep printing after logging out** setting on the **Printers** settings tab is disabled, all jobs will be canceled after logging out.

To cancel stuck jobs:

1. On the login screen, tap the **Check Status** button. You are redirected to the printing device's native panel screen.



2. On the screen, select the **Current Job** tab. The Current Job tab opens.
3. On the tab, select all jobs by tapping on them. Tap the **Del. Resv.** button on the right side of the tab, and confirm by tapping **Delete** on the pop-up window.



4. To return to the MyQ login screen, tap the **Check Status** button in the lower-left corner of the screen.
